





From the Pastor's Desk:

What Do We See

I was distributing Holy Communion at the Mass last Sunday at Sauble Beach. As people were coming up in line to receive communion, a little girl lined up for a blessing. I would venture a guess that she was about 5 years old. She stopped in front of me, with hands folded

together as a sign that she desired to be blessed. I offered her a blessing as I usually do, and then something unexpected happened. This little girl put her arms around my legs and gave me a big hug. Why am I telling you this? Well, perhaps because that moment stayed with me for a week now. Even when a priest friend of mine called me and

asked, "What's new in the Church? What do you know? What have you heard?" He was interested in hearing about negative things, gossip, etc. Instead I shared the story with him about the little girl who gave the priest a hug after receiving a blessing. What I'm realizing is that in the midst of all the negative things that exist in the Church, there are also many good things. The good are usually small, and humble, and it's easy to miss them. But we should not. It is in these small things that we find life. I never thought that a little girl's hug could give me so much joy. It is so easy for us to see the negatives, the scandals, the gossip, etc. But what about all the good and beautiful things that God is doing all around us? They may seem smaller than the bad things we notice so easily, but just because they seem Fr. Woitek Kuzma small doesn't mean they are.

A Seminarian's Thoughts:

The lights in our dormitory mercilessly flashed on that first morning in July at the minor seminary. "Christ our King!" yelled the Legionary brother patrolling the hall. Everyone bellowed back the response, "Thy Kingdom come!" We all scrambled to make our beds, tucking the edges of the sheets neatly into hospital corners, as they called them. From there it was a mad rush down to the showers. With the Legionaries, if you spent more than sixty seconds in the shower, that was too long. You were in and out. All business. Businessmen say that time is money. The Legionaries say, "Time is Kingdom," as in the Kingdom of God. Every moment of every day we were striving to make God's Kingdom come on earth, as we pray in the Our Father.

Within twenty minutes of wake-up time, we were all expected to be ready: fully dressed, hair combed, shoes shines, and lined up straight for inspection. We then marched down to the chapel for morning prayer, meditation, and Mass. That first morning was quite the shock to my system. It was not a pleasant experience. I remember calling my parents after a few days had passed. They asked me how everything was going. "It's hellish here," I responded. "But I'm not leaving; this is my vocation. This is where God wants me to be." I was determined to tough it out, no matter how much I struggled or how miserable the early morning rush was. I couldn't let God down after he'd given me this amazing opportunity to serve him as a Legionary priest.

Diocese to Move Ahead with Capital Campaign -The Diocese of Hamilton has decided to move forward with a Parish-focused capital campaign after a recent study found support from 83 percent of the respondents. The planning study was conducted from May through June by the Steier Group, a campaign consulting firm, and included more than 900 clergy and lay participants. Under the proposed campaign plan, 75 percent of the funds raised would go to the Parishes for projects of their choosing, 15 percent to diocesan ministries and 10 percent to support Parishes in need.
