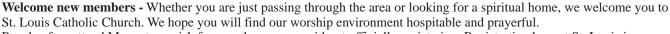

Reflection on the First Reading from Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

These are challenging words directed to the nation of Israel upon its return from exile, which came to an end in 538 BC with the Persian victory over the Babylonians. The years following Israel's return to its cherished land proved to be very tumultuous. Not only did the reconstruction of the Temple mean a return to the religious requirement of animals sacrifice, but also years of political instability when Israel was occupied first by the Greeks and then by the Romans. As a result, the Hebrew religion divided into competing sects that sought to win the people's loyalty.

This is the circumstance in which Isaiah appears, calling himself the "anointed." Freed from a captivity in a foreign land endured for more than forty years, the Hebrew people return to their land to find it destroyed and desecrated. Isaiah works to reassure them that this is to be a time of favour for them by their God.

Isaiah instructs Israel to rejoice in the Lord even through the temptation may be to look at the return to their destroyed and desolate land as a mistake. He interprets this homecoming as a renewal of the covenant in which God will treat the nation as His espoused. Moreover, Israel's newfound fortune is to be a sign of justice for other nations. 
