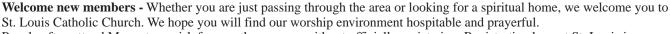

Reflection on the First Reading from Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11

Chapter 40 of the Book of Isaiah begins the portion of the Isaiah that is referred to by the scripture scholars as Deutero (meaning "Second") Isaiah. From chapters 40 to 55, the Prophet speaks words of comfort to the people of Israel, who have just completed their time of exile in Babylon. Imagine having been torn away from your home and your community, forced into labour for the foreign people, adapting to the new way of life in a land not your own, and then being invited to return to your homeland, which had been occupied by others and destroyed in the process. The summons to return would undoubtedly be met with a certain fear and resistance. Many exiles had to say to themselves, "We're doing just fine in our new home; why would we ever want to go back there?"

Nevertheless, Isaiah reassures the people that no longer shall they feel punished by God. Instead, they will experience the rewards of God's care. Once again, He will be shepherd for His people. He will give them courage to make known the good news of their return to all the nations. As Israel rejoices once again in its chosen status, their joy will echo forth to all the world as an invitation to see the revelation of the Lord's glory. Freedom from exile is not only for the people of Israel: it is for the salvation of every nation. "Then the glory of the Lords shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together."

Deutero-Isaiah attempts here to balance words of comfort with the command to prepare the Lord's way. In their return from exile, the people are to make their pilgrimage homewards by imagining the world anew and by trusting that the Lord journeys with them. Images of straight highways, mountains made low and valleys turned into plains are not simply for the Prophet and his people of long ago. Instead, they represent the wonder of all that God is accomplishing for His people today. His is a strong arm that can do all things. Yet this is the tender shepherd who never let His sheep go astray. (From the Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers, and Proclaimers of the Word.)

Second Week of Advent

For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life. John 3:16.

Jesus shows us that true love, the love that comes from God, makes no distinction between friend and foes, between people who are for us and people who are against us, people

who do us a favour and people who do us ill. God makes no such distinctions. He loves all human beings, good or bad, with the same unconditional love. (Jesus: A Gospel, 10)

We live in a world where conditions apply in almost every aspect of life. You can buy a car of your dreams under these conditions. The bank will loan you money provided you agree to pay it back. In most everything you do, it seems there are strings attached. But what would it be like to have the strings be all gone, at least where love is concerned?

We've all heard it said, "A friend is someone that knows all there is not know about you and loves you anyway." Do you have a friend like that? In the Gospel of John, we hear that friend is Jesus. God knows us inside and out and yet still loves us so much that He gave us Jesus to prove it. That is the message God gives to the world in His only Son Jesus.

If that isn't love, I don't know what is.

Dear Lord, the message of Advent is a message of your unconditional love for all the world. In your mercy, help me carry that message to others. Amen.

Immaculate Conception of Blessed Virgin Mary - December 8



In 1854, Pope Pius IX's solemn declaration, clarified with finality the long-held belief of the Church that Mary was conceived free from original sin. In proclaiming the Immaculate Conception of Mary as a dogma of the Church, the pope expressed precisely and clearly that Mary was conceived free

from the stain of original sin. This privilege of Mary derives from God's having chosen her as Mother of the Savior; thus she received the benefits of salvation in Christ from the very moment of her conception.

This great gift to Mary, an ordinary human being just like us, was fitting because she was destined to be Mother of God. The purity and holiness of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a model for all Christians.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says of the Immaculate Conception of Mary:

490. To become the mother of the Savior, Mary "was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to such a role". The angel Gabriel at the moment of the annunciation salutes her as "full of grace". In fact, in order for Mary to be able to give the free assent of her faith to the annuncement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be wholly borne by God's grace.

491. Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Pope Pius IX proclaimed in 1844: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin."
