Reflection on the First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 5:28-32,40b-41

The story of the nascent Church spreading though the Mediterranean region is really the story of the Apostles' display of courageous faith. For instance, the Gospel would not have arrived in Antioch if it were not for the conviction of Paul and Barnabas. Likewise, Peter is seen in today's reading as remaining steadfast in faith despite the suffering that is to be inflicted upon him by the Sanhedrin.

Even stronger than the Apostles' faith and their resolve to undergo persecution for the sake of the Lord's name is the overall power and authority of God's Word. When the high priest berates Peter and his companions for teaching in Jesus' name, Peter responds simply that obedience to God is more important than following a human mandate. Those who are witnesses of Jesus' execution and exaltation, those who have been granted the power of the Holy Spirit, must teach in Jesus' name.

What we are to see in this debate is that Peter and those with him are not speaking by their own authority; it is by the power of God that they are able to testify to God's amazing desire to forgive those who are willing to embrace repentance. Furthermore, we see in this encounter the beginning of a sense of revelry in martyrdom; the Apostles leave the Sanhedrin rejoicing because they were "considered worthy to suffer dishonour for the sake of the name." (From the Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers, and Proclaimers of the Word.)

collected \$262.25 for D&P Relief Fund for Ukraine.



The Bible and the Church Fathers – video study program from St. Paul Centre for Biblical Theology after both Sunday Masses in the Large Hall. A 20 minute video with a brief discussion. Refreshments offered. Come and check it out.

Synopsis of the previous session ("Real Presence"):

Covenant sacrifices were meant to make us a family. But the sacrifice of the New Covenant actually brings communion with the Body and Blood of Jesus. The OT covenants were unable to bring full communion with God. As sinful people, we can't achieve this communion on our own. And though God entered into covenants with His people, they were always unbalanced. There is nothing we could offer to the Father that He wasn't already owed. But in the "fullness of time" Christ came as mediator. As a sinless priest, He offered to the Father His very life. Now we share in this communion every time we go to Mass and participate in the New Covenant – The Eucharist.


Because of this, the New Covenant is vital to our lives as Christians. "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and the prayers". (Acts 2:42)

It should be no surprise, then, that the Fathers also stand as clear witnesses to the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. While "transubstantiation" – the belief that the bread and wine are truly transformed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ at the words of consecration at Mass – might not have been formally defined until Council of Trent in the 16th century, the Church has believed it from the very beginning. It was defined only when it was challenged by the Protestant reformers, as false teaching is usually the motivation to formally define long-held beliefs. Real Presence was at the heart of the Gospel we received from Christ.

St. Ignatius of Antioch: "They [i.e. the Gnostics] abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer, because they do not confess that THE EUCHARIST IS THE FLESH OF OUR SAVIOUR JESUS CHRIST, flesh which suffered for our sins and which the Father, in His goodness, raised up again" (Letter to Smyrnians 7:1 [c. A.D.110).

St. Cyril of Jerusalem: "The bread and the wine of the Eucharist before the holy invocation of the adorable Trinity were simple bread and wine, but the invocation having been made, the bread becomes the body of Christ and the wine the blood of Christ" (Catechetical Lectures 19:7 [A.D. 350]).

St. Augustine: "I promised you [new Christians], who have now been baptized, a sermon in which I would explain the sacrament of the Lord's Table. . . . That bread which you see on the altar, having been sanctified by the word of God, is the body of Christ. That chalice, or rather, what is in that chalice, having been sanctified by the word of God, is the blood of Christ" (Sermons 227 [A.D. 411]).


