

Reflection on the First Reading: Malachi 4:1-2

The context for this reading is the people's complaint that it is useless to serve God. It seems to them that, even though the arrogant and the evildoers insult and test God, they continue to enjoy the promised blessings of success and prosperity. In the face of this apparent divine unfairness, the faithful ask, "What do we profit by keeping his command?"

In response, Malachi assures them that the "day" is coming when the Lord of Hosts (or of Armies) will rectify this situation. The Prophet imagines "the day" as a blazing hot oven whose heat will set on fire and destroy those who are arrogant and who do evil. Nothing -"neither root nor branch" - will be left of them.

On that same day, "for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings." To fear or reverence the Lord's name entails following the Lord's instructions, even when these seem naïve and purposeless.

The image of the "sun of righteousness" references a winged solar disk, which was a widespread symbol in the biblical world. Given the Middle Eastern climate these images of a sun with wings hovering over the earth aptly convey divine omnipresence and uncontested power. Here the faithful take refuge in the shadow of Lord's "wings", where they are protected from all manner of harm and enjoy continuous blessings. (Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers, & Proclaimers of the Word.)

St. Elizabeth of Hungary (1207–Nov. 17, 1231)

In her short life, Elizabeth manifested such great love for the poor and suffering that she has become the patroness of Catholic charities and of the Secular Franciscan Order. The daughter of the King of Hungary, Elizabeth chose a life of penance and asceticism when a



life of leisure and luxury could easily have been hers. This choice endeared her in the hearts of the common people throughout Europe.

At the age of 14, Elizabeth was married to Louis of Thuringia, whom she deeply loved. She bore three children. Under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick. Seeking to become one with the poor, she wore simple clothing. Daily she would take bread to hundreds of the poorest in the land who came to her gate.


After six years of marriage, her husband died in the Crusades, and Elizabeth was grief-stricken. Her husband's family looked upon her as squandering the royal purse, and mistreated her, finally throwing her out of the palace. The return of her husband's allies from the Crusades resulted in her being reinstated, since her son was legal heir to the throne.

In 1228, Elizabeth joined the Secular Franciscan Order, spending the remaining few years of her life caring for the poor in a hospital which she founded in honour of St. Francis of Assisi. Elizabeth's health declined, and she died before her 24th birthday in 1231. Her great popularity resulted in her canonization four years later. Reflection - Elizabeth understood well the lesson Jesus taught when he washed his disciples' feet at the Last Supper: The Christian must be one who serves the humblest needs of others, even if one serves from an exalted position. Of royal blood, Elizabeth could have lorded it over her subjects. Yet she served them with such a loving heart that her brief life won for her a special place in the hearts of many. Elizabeth is also an example to us in her following the guidance of a spiritual director. Growth in the spiritual life is a difficult process. We can play games very easily if we don't have someone to challenge us.
