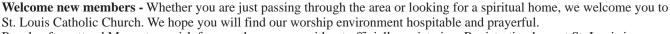

#### Reflection on the First Reading: Isaiah 63:16b-17, 64:1, 3-8

The new Liturgical year begins with a fervent prayer for restoration. Although originally uttered in the context of the Hebrew people's return from captivity in Babylon in the sixth century BC, the words of the Prophet Isaiah are just as powerful and poignant in our day. Great hope was certainly in the hearts of all of those called to journey back to the land of their ancestors. Yet their return was far from joyful. Instead they found their Temple in ruins and their lands pillaged and burned. Even with this devastation before them, they called out in confidence to God, knowing that he alone could make their return a source of blessing.

A basic key to grasping the covenantal relationship between God and his chosen people Israel is the cycle of exile and return. Sin leads to the people's punishment, but banishment from grace allows the nation the opportunity to repent. In turn, God sees their repentance and chooses them as His own once again. This theological cycle of redemption is the foundation of the Prophet's desire to summon the people as a whole back to Jerusalem despite its ravaged and forsaken condition. To "return" is to acknowledge the never-ending power of God to maintain and fortify the covenant, even in what appears to be a time of insurmountable misfortune.

Isaiah calls out to God with questions: "Why, O Lord, do you make us stray from your ways and harden our heart, so that we do not fear you?" Recall here the wanderings of the Israelites in the wilderness and God's hardening of Pharaoh's heart (Exodus 7:3) so that the Israelites would have to work that much harder for their freedom. God desires people who have to seek out His mercy and forgiveness. Pleading for God's awesome wonders on behalf of the people, Isaiah calls the nation to greater fidelity and a renewed hope that God will provide. (From the Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers, and Proclaimers of the Word.)


