

Reflections on the Second Reading: James 3:16 – 4:3

James' view of the wickedness within the Christian community is more nuanced than that described in the First Reading from Wisdom. For him, no one always acts justly, nor is anyone irredeemably evil. Everyone must work on rooting out personal wicked habits. Here, James targets envy and selfish ambition or rivalry as the sources of "wickedness of every kind". He writes that those who seek recognition or insist on getting their own way are not yet living by wisdom "from above." They still follow human inclinations and ape the behaviours of those whose worldly position or influence they desire for themselves.

Divine Wisdom is first of all pure - holy or different from the wisdom of the crowd. It is innocent or untainted. Those who live by Divine Wisdom do not enshrine personal opinions and foist them off on the community. Rather, they prize the peace and well being of all. With deliberate gentleness or courtesy, they work to resolve disagreements. They give in to others and show mercy. They are impartial and consistent in their treatment of everyone. They do not, for example, welcome those who agree with them and ignore those who do not. All that they say or do is sincere and genuine,

Instead of being in "conflicts" (Greek polemos, English "polemics") "among you," James wants the baptized to make war on their inner cravings and passions, which are tearing the community apart. To vanquish these, they need the divine guidance for which they no longer pray and so do not receive. They pray, but for the wrong things. They ask God to do their will, to champion their cause. Therefore, their prayers go unanswered. (From the Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers, and Proclaimers of the Word)

Prayer of Blessed William Chaminade

O chaste spouse of the most pure and most holy of creatures, how happy you must be for having found such favour and grace before the Eternal Father, who gave His Son; before the Son who made you the tutor of his sacred humanity; before the Holy Spirit who entrusted his spouse to you so that you could be like the cherubim who guarded the fruit of life in the garden of Eden. How happy and blessed are they whom you love and whom you take under your protection!

O faithful guardian of the Mother of God, keep those who honour you amid the trials and joys of this life. Lovable tutor of Jesus, help your servants in the dangers and difficulties of their exile: may they feel the effects of your love. Obtain for them devotion to your spouse, fidelity to your Son, unfailing respect for the Eternal Father who reigns with the Holy Spirit through endless ages. Amen.

Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, fondly known by all as 'Padre Pio' is perhaps the most famous saint known for bearing the stigmata, the Holy Wounds of Christ, for 50 years of his life! He is remembered by many for many reasons—his infallible devotion, his constant praying of the rosary, the miracles he performed, and most importantly, the prediction he made in reference to Pope John Paul II (although some sources deny it). Interestingly, it was none other than this very pope who canonized him in 2002, more than 43 years after his death.

Padre Pio always emphasized on leading a holy life. He also said that his real mission will start post his death. Many Catholic believers offer their prayers to him night and day, and seek his healing touch. His precious words are among the many things that Padre Pio has left us.

- † Always humble yourself lovingly before God and man, because God speaks to those who are truly humble of heart, and enriches them with His aifts.
- † Whoever does not meditate, is like someone who never looks in the mirror before going out, doesn't bother to see if he's tidy, and may go out dirty without knowing it. The person who meditates and turns his mind to God, who is the mirror of his soul, seeks to know his faults, tries to correct them, moderates his impulses, and puts his conscience in order.
- † You complain because the same trials are constantly returning. But look here, what have you to fear? Are you afraid of the divine craftsman who wants to perfect His masterpiece in this way? Would you like to come from the hands of such a magnificent Artist as a mere sketch and no more?
- † Prayer is the best weapon we have; it is the key to God's heart. You must speak to Jesus not only with your lips, but with your heart. In fact on certain occasions you should only speak to Him with your heart.
- † Without Jesus you can do nothing. In the end, the gamble of our life is all in this Child. I live for Jesus Christ, I live for his glory, I live to serve him, I live to love him. In Jesus everything has an answer. Without him only a big void.


