

The Ascension of the Lord



This Sunday, the Church celebrates the Ascension of the Lord, and it is an important feast day and a day of obligation because it points to one important aspect of our faith: *"Jesus has gone up to heaven to prepare a place for us so that where He is we too shall be."* At His Resurrection, He conquered sin

and death and raised us to life. In the Ascension, this life takes on a clearer and more profound aspect-eternal life in heaven with Jesus.

That should make us set our hearts on things of above and not on things of the earth. But does that mean that we don't bother about anything and do nothing about our life here on earth?

Of course, it is needless to answer that question. But at the same time, we also need to understand that our life on earth is a preparation for the eternal life of heaven. So, what must we do on earth then?

What Jesus said to the Eleven, He also says to us: "Go into all the world, proclaim the Good News to the whole creation." And Jesus also gave a list of signs that will be associated with believers: they will cast out devils, have the gift of tongues, pick up snakes in their hands and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.

All that seems rather lofty and maybe even unbelievable. Can we do all that? Have we done all that?

Yet, before we discourage ourselves with a barrage of "No" to what Jesus said, we need to find out what is the sign that Jesus wants us to be. And we have to remember before He ascends into heaven, Jesus wants us to prepare ourselves for the descent of the Holy Spirit, who will empower us to be witnesses and to be signs. It means that we have to set our hearts on the things of above and with this we will be witnesses and signs to the people of the earth. We must be living signs to point them to heaven. Because that's where we are going and we want them to go along with us.

The question is: have we fulfilled the command of Jesus to proclaim the Good News to the whole creation? How do we do it? *Fr. Aegidius Warsito SCJ*


