BE BEHIND THE SCENES WITH 4TH SUNDAY OF LENT

Aren't the intricate plots in a soap opera amazing? Soaps imitate life, to a degree, with intertwining characters, conversations, and crises. But to know the whole story, we have to go "behind the scenes" and ask, What motives, feelings, and questions are at play?"

Take our story of the blind man today. It begins with the question, "Who sinned, this man or his parents?" This is Jesus' cue to correct the ancient belief that illness and misfortune result from God's punishment for sin. "Neither the man nor his parents sinned." The man is blind "so that the works of God might be made visible through him." The "wild card" here is Jesus—he obviously heals on the Sabbath, breaking the religious law.

So the Pharisees try to discredit Jesus as a sinner who could not come from God. Only the blind man sees clearly: "I was blind, and now I can see-Jesus has to be from God." The Pharisees remain blind because they refuse to see and bow down before the sacred truth: that Jesus is the Son of God, who alone can break the power of evil by healing the man's blindness.

If the Pharisees would admit their blindness, and ask "Who are you, Lord? Help me believe!" they would see Christ. But don't we, too, sometimes cling to the darkness of our own arrogance, certitude, or false judgment? When we judge self-righteously, we expel ourselves from Jesus' community; we claim to see, but we are pitifully blind. Let us instead be blind to anything that causes us to judge someone else.

And, take heart! If we feel "expelled" from God's mercy, Jesus comes personally to us in Lent, eager to open the blind eyes of our hearts so we can really see him in each other.

Go in peace to love and serve our God!

"I was a rebel," the now 22-year-old said, adding he often broke the cardinal rule at the Silent Voice Sign Language Summer Camp by speaking rather than signing. "Looking back, it was disrespectful." It wasn't until Tyler was too old to attend the day camp for deaf children that he realized what he'd learned at Silent Voice was a priceless gift. He began to understand his language skill was in high demand and that becoming an interpreter was a career he wanted to pursue. So, after graduating from high school, Tyler enrolled in the American Sign Language program at Toronto's George Brown College. Determined to right the wrongs of his youth, he also signed up to be a counsellor at the SLSP camp. One of the most important lessons for him was that people and attitudes can change. "It made me appreciate the good intentions of people who helped me grow up," Tyler said. "It's a good feeling knowing someone cared about me so much. I appreciate it now. It really helped me see the best in people." Now he's passing it forward.
