# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

he bulletin blurb for this Sunday was actually written a few days before Easter with this thought in mind, I pray that all of you had a Blessed Easter with your loved ones.

The Second Sunday of Easter always brings us the Gospel passage of Thomas and his unbelief in the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. The only way Thomas would believe that Jesus had risen was to put his fingers into the wounds He suffered at Calvary. Good Friday had ended all the hopes he had pinned on Christ. It shattered his faith to the point whereby he made no attempt to hide his doubts.

We need to see Thomas as being a precious figure, one who does us all a favour in demanding proof of the Resurrection. In fact, he is only echoing the doubts and uncertainties which darken our minds and cloud our faith from time to time, when dreams are crushed by an unexpected death, a broken relationship of or some other heavy cross to bear. The Gospel points out that faith does not always come easily. We need to see that ultimately, faith is what makes life meaningful because it's an adventure of the spirit searching for an encounter with God.

Today, we must remember that this is our first gathering after Easter Sunday. Last week we expressed and celebrated that belief which makes our faith so unique. We believe that the Son of God came among us, suffered and died for us, and that He rose from the dead. This week, our readings call us not so much to express our faith, but to respond to it and to trust it.

What we believe is, well, unbelievable. But we believe anyway. We are called to act on this belief. The world of science scoffs at our belief in One who rose from the dead, but scientists act on faith as well. Scientists will rarely allow themselves to be pinned down on an absolute. When pressed, a particular scientist will say that such and such has not yet been proven but 'I believe this to be.' Therefore, a scientist acts on his/her belief. And so, we too, must act on ours.

Like Thomes, we are going to have great moments of disbelief in our lives. Some things are going to seem just not possible. However, impossibilities are not just restricted to matters of faith. We find it hard to believe a lot of things, especially as regards Church teaching. Still, we are called to believe that God is a part of all of this. We are called to trust.

It is worth remembering that the faith of the Apostles was no overnight experience, but something gradual which increased as they became more intimate with Christ. The same is true of our faith, it will grow and deepen provided we are more Christ-like in our daily living.

Like St. Thomas, we are a mixture of belief and unbelief. We have faith in our hearts and doubts in our minds. Our response to the Resurrection is to trust. God will take care of us. We do not fear but rejoice.
