

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

fter writing about Saints Peter and Paul in late June, I decided to write about another famous Saint this Sunday.

St. Lawrence's Feast Day is celebrated on August 10th each year, however it is not celebrated this year because it falls on a Sunday.

We know St. Lawrence as being an Archdeacon of the Church in the Third Century in Rome. I was looking up some information about this great Saint and we, as a country, have a number of connections to him.

St. Lawrence is one of the patron saints of Canada and there are many landmarks named after him. The most famous is the St. Lawrence River. Jacques Cartier came across the mouth of the waterway in 1535 on the Feast Day of St. Lawrence, August 10th.

In our own Diocese of Hamilton, one of the most beautiful churches is St. Lawrence Church in the north end of the city. I encourage you, if you happen to be in Hamilton, to look up and visit this beautiful church. You will not be disappointed.

Locally, here in Acton, we also have a connection with St. Lawrence. He is the patron saint of many vocations. For us, he is the Patron Saint of tanners, and course, Acton was developed on the tannery business. St. Lawrence is also the Patron Saint of firefighters and cooks. Many of us know or have loved ones in these fields. He is also the Patron Saint of archivists and librarians because he was entrusted with keeping the writings of the early Church. Once again, many of us have loved ones in these fields.

Perhaps, the most famous story about St. Lawrence was just before his execution and martyrdom. The Roman Empire started a severe persecution of Christians in the year 258 A.D. Pope Sixtus II was arrested, and he advised St. Lawrence to take care of the Church's artifacts. The Prefect of Rome ordered St. Lawrence to turn over the treasures of the Church to the Empire. St. Lawrence defied this order by giving monetary sums and other treasures to the poor of Rome. When he was summoned to face the Prefect, he was again ordered to turn over these treasures. What St. Lawrence presented was people who were poor, blind, and sick, boasting that these

were the 'treasures' of the Church. Obviously, this led to St. Lawrence being imprisoned and ultimately executed.

Traditionally, it is believed that he baptized fellow prisoners while waiting to be martyred. He was basically roasted alive on a large grill, but it was believed that he was joyful in accepting his martyrdom in following Christ.

What can we learn from St. Lawrence today? We can learn that throughout our daily struggles we can pray to St, Lawrence to give us the strength and perseverance to carry on with our lives with a sense of joy which St. Lawrence possessed in many ways.

I wish to once again offer thanks to all parishioners for your payers and Mass Intentions following the death of my sister, Jane McDowall in July. My family also extends their most sincere gratitude.


