

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ith Saint John Henry Newman being named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Leo XIV in July, my friend Father Steve Lape had a bulletin blurb on the Sunday when I was visiting him. Once again, he was kind enough to allow me to publish it in our bulletin for this Sunday.

- 1. What does the title "Doctor of the Church" mean? Usually when we think of a doctor, it's someone in the medical field who works to heal people who have physical, mental and/or psychological illness. Yet, the term 'Doctor of the Church' refers to a Catholic saint contributions who has made significant understanding Christian doctrine in the catholic Church through his or her exceptional knowledge of the faith, as communicated in writings and teachings by the individual, as well as through the holiness of how that saint lived. Such theological or spiritual works have proven to have stood the test of time, continuing to influence and illuminate generations of people in more clearly comprehending various aspects of our faith in Christ.
- 2. How many Doctors of the Church are there now in the Catholic Church, including St. John Henry Newman? 38 have been declared so far.
- 3. Who were the 1st saints to be recognized as Doctors of the Church? Saints Ambrose (c.339-397), Augustine (354-430), Jerome (c.347-420), and Pope Gregory the Great (c.540-604).
- 4. When were the 1st Doctors declared? In 1298, Pope Boniface VIII declared them Doctors of the Church. Although that was the year these four saints were officially given the title, they had long been considered as such unofficially for many years before.
- 5. What women have been so named? Saints Teresa of Avila (1515-1582) in 1970, Catherine of Siena (1347-1380) in 1970, Therese of Lisieux (1873-1897) in 1997, and Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179) in 2012.
- 6. Who bestows such a title on a saint? The Pope makes that official determination, usually after consultation with other bishops and the Dicastery of the Causes of Saints. The person must already be declared a saint in the Catholic Church to be eligible for consideration in becoming a Doctor of the Church.
- 7. What Doctors of the Church have feast days in September? Five of them do: Saint Gregory the Great

on September 3rd, Saint John Chrysostom on September the 13th, Saints Robert Bellarmine and Hildegard of Bingen on September 17th, and Saint Jerome on September 30th.


