A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

s we begin the Season of Advent, I came across a passage from the Ceremonies of the Liturgical Year Manual written by Msgr. Peter Elliott, which states the meaning and purpose of the season.

Msgr. Elliott states: "Advent is a time of preparation and reflection, hope, and anticipation. The coming of the Eternal Son of God is celebrated in the three ways we experience time: past, present, and future. He came for us in our flesh through the Incarnation; He comes to us in the Church through grace; He will come at the end of time to judge us, living or dead."

At any mass the priest, after the Our Father is prayed, interjects a prayer that the Lord "will protect us from all evil as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ." Advent is a time of spiritual preparation for the celebration of Christmas, but it is not just this. Advent also serves to remind us that we are waiting for Christ to come again. Preparing for Christmas during Advent should teach us how to prepare for the Second Coming.

Last week we celebrated the Feast of Christ the King, which anticipates Christ's coming again. This image should help us to shape our Advent. As we begin a new liturgical year, on this First Sunday of Advent, having just celebrated Christ the King reminds us that we are beginning the circle once more.

Though Advent points us more immediately to Christmas, it also points us toward the next celebration of the Feast of Christ the King, and more, it helps us to look even past Christ the King to the real event of Christ's coming in glory.

Obviously, we identify Christmas with giving. We give gifts and we will even give more to charity over the next four weeks than any other time of the year. We must see that Christmas should be more that just a time of giving. Advent should help us approach Christmas with a sense of gratitude. God so loves us that He sent us a Saviour. If Christmas giving is to make sense, we must identify our Christmas giving as a way of trying to imitate God. God gives, so we give.

We must thank God for the gift that has been given. Advent allows us to remember to build gratitude into our seasonal celebration. Though many people try to make the end of time and the Second Coming as a fearful time of tribulation, it really is not this. The Second Coming is a promise of hope. Christ has come. Christ will come again! We should not fear this. Rather, we must be grateful for this.

As we begin this Advent season, we must remember that it helps us to believe in a promise and to have gratitude for it. It also reminds us to give as God gives in order to be prepared for Jesus' glorious return. As we put up our decorations, we can experience the beauty that God still provides. As we wrap our gifts, we can experience the joy that comes from imitation our Saviour.
