A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ith the ongoing Canada Post mail strike we have lost one of the great traditions of this Advent Season, the sending and receiving of Christmas cards

It is very easy to say that people do not send Christmas cards as they did in previous times. This is true, but it would be wonderful to think that once this postal strike ends, we will realize what we have lost out on this Christmas season. We may have to wait till next year to experience the joy of mailing and receiving Christmas cards once again.

Perhaps over the years our selection of Christmas cards has said in many ways how we approach this Advent/Christmas Season. I can remember as a young boy that my parents would every Christmas receive a card from our Dentist, Dr. Prouse. What I remember about his cards was that they were always humorous in nature. My parents would laugh out loud at the cards which he sent. This always surprised me because I was always afraid of Dr. Prouse! However, as you get older, you realize that every child was afraid to go to the dentist!

Since my ordination as a priest, I have made it a practice to always purchase and send Christmas cards which have images of the birth of our Saviour. Early in my priesthood I was uncomfortable in sending a religious card to someone who was not religious or was away from the practice of faith. Today I send the same religious cards to everyone, no matter who it is. As a priest, I have an obligation and responsibility to let others know what we celebrate at the time of the year, the coming of our Saviour!

In the Gospel of this Third Sunday of Advent, we encounter people who would have chosen religious themed Christmas cards if they had been available at the time. The tax collectors and the soldiers were not part of the 'accepted' group. They were hated and despised. They were cut off from mainstream worshipping. They were lonely. The possibility of salvation was indeed a message of hope for them. They needed a card that gave a message of hope. Laughs are easy. Hope requires more.

Once again, when we can mail Christmas cards properly, we may need to send them as an exercise in faith. This may be an exercise that allows us to connect to our faith and the purpose of our celebration. I wish to take this opportunity to thank the Knights of Columbus of our Parish who every year sell beautiful Christmas cards at the back of the church. This year obviously it has been more difficult to offer this service. There are still opportunities to purchase a box of cards before Christmas. You don't need to put a stamp on an envelope to state and believe what we celebrate this Christmas Season.
