A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

he Third Sunday of Advent is called 'Gaudete Sunday' which means 'to rejoice'. We light the third, rose-coloured candle of our Advent wreath and the priest may wear rose coloured vestments to celebrate the Mass. This Sunday reminds us that we are at the halfway point of the Advent Season. One's mindset should be not that the Lord is coming but rather that He is here so let us rejoice.

The Gospel of this Third Sunday poses the question: "Who are you?" It is a question rightfully asked by anyone who would come and be with us.

When asked who we are, our usual response is to offer our name: "I am..." but today's question posed to John by the leaders, is asking for more. It is asking for the essence of who we are. It is asking us to reveal the foundation of our identity. It can be an uncomfortable query.

This Third Sunday of Advent we are being reminded that the first and best answer is "I am a Christian, a follower of Jesus Christ." We can be strengthened and encouraged in our response by looking at John the Baptist. He was an individual who had a clear sense of who he was. His sense of self was rooted in his belief that his identity was bound intimately with who God is, and John saw everything he did as somehow being an outward expression of his Faith. Many were brought to a new understanding of their Faith because of his clearly defined sense of self.

The Season of Advent calls us to ask: "Who am I?" It is a question we may struggle with but if we are honest with ourselves, then we can overcome any challenges and be strengthened by the gift of Advent. It can help us to remember who we are, and to focus on who we are called to be.
