A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

t is hard to believe that we have come to the Fourth Sunday of Advent, which is the last Sunday we will celebrate this season.

This Sunday we are re-introduced to a figure which many forget to think about during the Advent Season, this being St. Joseph. The Nativity stories of Matthew and Luke blend and meld together in our memories. Also in our memories, other than Jesus Himself, Mary takes centre stage in our annual re-telling of the birth of Jesus.

Luke does focus on Mary, and Luke's story is the one most often quoted, but it is important to realize that Matthew and Luke are different. For Matthew, Joseph is the central figure.

A couple of weeks ago, we read of King Ahoz of Judah who gave up his faith and the faith of his people to keep his throne at any cost. Matthew presents Joseph as the absolute opposite of King Ahoz. Ahoz's lack of trust and faith cost Judah its independence and almost its very existence. The trust and faithfulness of Joseph brought a new King who ushered in a new kingdom, the Kingdom of God.

Joseph was a "righteous man" according to Matthew. This tells us that Joseph followed the law and would have been present regularly with other men in the Synagogue of his community. Joseph had a relationship with God that allowed him to listen to God's will and to live it with courage.

Mary, already considered a wife, was pregnant. Joseph wished to spare her the shameful experience of exposure and punishment, so he sought to quietly divorce her. Through what Matthew calls an angel, Joseph changed his mind and took Mary anyway, loving her Child as his own.

Joseph, who often sits alone at Christmas, should be seen as a model for all of us in our life with God. He was presented with circumstances that must have caused him great pain and confusion. Joseph, a righteous man, sought enlightenment, and it came. He trusted in God, he acted with courage and love, he took Mary

despite every reason not to, and the reward for us is Christmas and God's Kingdom.

On this last Sunday of Advent, we need to understand that two people, Mary and Joseph chose to trust in God despite their circumstances and confusion. Christmas just didn't happen. Christmas was an act of love.

Christmas Blessings to all of you and your loved ones this Christmas Season. Let us pray that the birth of our Saviour will give us a sense of joy and hope in our lives.
