A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ast year you may recall that Christmas fell on a Monday. This led to a very short time to celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent. We basically only had a few hours to celebrate that Sunday because parishes had to prepare for Christmas with the first masses being at 4 or 5 p.m. It felt strange to set up the parish Nativity Set a few days before the Fourth Sunday of Advent. It would have been impossible to have everything ready in a few hours on a Sunday afternoon.

This year we have a couple of extra days to celebrate and ponder the last Sunday of this Advent season. This Sunday, the scripture readings are alive with excitement about the Saviour who is coming very soon.

It is no surprise that the spotlight is focussed on Mary because no one can help us to better understand the meaning of Advent than Mary. The Visitation to her cousin Elizabeth is more than a happy exchange of support between two women sharing the joys of childbearing. We must see it as being a story of faith as well as one of friendship and human love.

Elizabeth clearly recognizes that Mary is carrying Jesus, the image of the unseen God, when she says: "Why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?" What a warm welcome the unborn Christ child received at Elizabeth's home in contrast to the cool welcome He would receive in Bethlehem when there was no room for them in the inn.

Mary reveals to all of us how we are to wait for Christ. She was carrying Him as a gift to a world in need and we are to do likewise. We are called to be signs of His presence when we give ourselves to others and what better time than as we approach Christmas, when we meet with family and friends with warmth and true feelings.

Today's passage from Luke is also about Jesus and John. Even before being born, one child was acknowledging the greatness of another. We all know that a baby isn't powerful, it needs defending. Yet Luke is claiming that Jesus, as an unborn child, brought change to the world. We must recognize this change in our lives as we come to the end of the Advent season.

All our Christmas celebrations are an empty sham if Jesus is not born into our hearts. Good things need to be done at a deeper level out of love and affection and in a spirit of generosity. The gifts that we give have no purpose unless God is part of the giving and unless we make Christmas a pattern to be followed in everyday living.

As we approach the birth of our Saviour, let us be like Mary who visited Elizabeth in a warm and loving way two thousand years ago. We can be inspired like Mary to offer the perfect Christmas gift which she did by saying: "Here I am Lord; I've come to do Your will."

May God bless all of you and your entire families this holy season. Let us share together the joy of the birth of our Saviour.
