Feast of the Holy Family

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

I hope and pray that all of you had a blessed Christmas with your families and friends.

In just celebrating Christmas, we had celebrated a day of “magic” that makes us feel warm and romantic about the world as it should be.

The Feast of the Holy Family can be the same thing, a day wherein we look to Joseph, Mary, and Jesus as a model of family life. This day can also be a day of challenge for us, and a day that makes us ask questions about our own families and our successes and failures.

In writing his Gospel, Matthew’s concern was in helping his Christian community, primarily of Jewish descent, understand who they were in a society that was beginning to reject them. Part of the purpose of today’s Gospel passage is to connect the story of Jesus with the story of Moses so that Matthew’s struggling community could find a sense of identity in Jesus. Certainly, Jesus’ coming out of Egypt represented a new beginning, as had Moses’ departure from Egypt.

So, what then, of us and our Catholic sense of family? The purpose of this Feast is to show the importance and sacredness of the family as the basic unit of Church life. It provides an opportunity to reflect on the quality of our home and family life, in so far as they imitate the values of the Holy Family of Nazareth. Family life is a full-time job which is not so much about parents and children living under on roof as it is about their hearts beating together in harmony and love. This will happen if the message of Christ in all its richness is found within its walls.

Religion begins at home and parents are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith. Handing on the faith means handing on a way of life. It’s no use parents urging their children to pray if prayer is not part of their own adult lives. Or if the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion etc. are just one day to celebrate without the opportunity to nourish and strengthen their children’s lives through their own witnessing of the sacraments.

On this, the Feast of the Holy Family, we must realize that to compete with our own culture that does not know what a family is or should be, to keep our families together, to preserve our Christian identities, we must attach ourselves to God. Someone once said that the worst thing about cliches is that they are true. It is true, then, that the family that prays together stays together.
