A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ith this Sunday, The First Sunday of Advent, we begin a new liturgical year. We also start to read and pray from the Gospel of Mark. This particular Gospel was the first one to be written and it is also the shortest of them.

As we move into our new Church year, and as we begin our anticipation of the celebration of Christmas, it is most appropriate that on the First Sunday of Advent we listen to a passage from Mark that is about the future, for Advent, our own future, and the preparation for Christmas.

The 13th Chapter of Mark is often called "little Apocalypse". There are two full books from the Bible that are also apocalyptic, that is, concerned with future things. These are the Book of Daniel in the Old Testament and the Book of Revelation from the New Testament. Of all the things that the 13th Chapter of Mark holds in common with the two other books is that they were written in very troubled times.

In the book of Daniel, Israel was facing destruction, in Revelation, the people were facing persecution, and in Mark, the people were in the midst of the horrible Roman-Jewish War, which would end in 70 A.D. with the destruction of the Temple.

Each of these books believed the world was coming to an end. Daniel, Revelation, and to a degree, Mark, were written in such situations where all hope seemed lost, and the only source of rescue left was the direct intervention of God. The most important thing that these books offer are the words of hope that, in fact, God will intervene to save His people.

There are certainly situations today which can make us very nervous. These include things like sickness, the economy, terrorism, etc. These are things which we can fear. What we must remember today is that our enemy is not fear. Rather, it is things such as complacency and apathy' basically the acceptance of the status quo.

What are we supposed to do? Mark gives us a single word, "watch"! This word is our hope. "Watch", for God will always surprise us. But we are not to be caught 'twiddling' our fingers. This hope belongs to those who have embraced their duty to God's Kingdom. It is our duty to keep hope alive.

If we are to appreciate Christmas, we must come to the realization that we need God. If we don't need God, the coming of His Son is no big deal. If, however, we can touch our fears, anxieties, or despair, we might begin to touch our neediness, and our hope that God will come again.

Christmas reminds us that Jesus came to us once. Advent is a reminder to stay focused. We must have the hope that He will come to us again.
