

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

raditionally, on the Second Sunday of Advent, the Gospel we speak of John the Baptist and his words of repentance, and the Coming of the Lord. This weekend, however; I wish to speak of the First Reading from Isaiah.

Isaiah's passage today is on of the most beautiful in Scripture. It describes a leader sent from God who would bring peace to the world. This was an intense image of hope. The kingdom of Judah had had a succession of kings, each one worse than the last.

King Ahaz had ascended to the throne when the passage for this Sunday was written by Isaiah. Ahaz was under siege, surrounded by the Kingdom of Israel to the North and the Kingdom of Syria to the South. Isaiah's message to the king was simple. If the king would remain faithful to God and to the Kingdom, Judah would triumph. However, the king was weak and decided to enter an alliance with the Kingdom of Assyria. An alliance which came with a heavy cost.

Ahaz had to surrender the religion of Yahweh (God) and instead worship the gods of Assyria. Judah could hardly have been moved further away from God. With the kingdom losing its soul, Isaiah turned his attention the people to offer them hope. The stump of Jesse, meaning the royal line, was being cut down; however, he assured the people, the line of Jesse would not end.

During the season of Advent, we are reminded to begin something new, to truly reform our lives. The challenge is to see what needs to be reformed.

Isaiah gives us the vision to follow. He describes the Saviour of Israel. He gives us something to look to and something to strive for. Perhaps this Advent it is time for us to look at ourselves and see if we have this vision of ourselves. What is to come from us?

King Ahaz acted out of self-interest, out of fear, and out of desperation. He was so intent on saving himself, that he sacrificed everything

of worth. In our own lives, what have we sacrificed out of our self-interests, our fears, and our desperation.

This Sunday, we must recognize that the tender stem of Jesse is our hope and our promise. It gives us the promise of the coming of the perfect King, Jesus Christ. If He becomes the centre of our lives' experiences, then we will truly and at last discover the peace of Christmas


