# A Word From Our Pastor:

Whith the image of leprosy being shown in the Gospel of this weekend, I thought it would be a good opportunity to talk about St. Damien of Molokai.

Most Catholics would know him simply as Father Damien. He was born in Belgium on January 3, 1840. He was ordained as a priest in 1864. Like Saint John Viannney, the Patron Saint of Priests, his superiors did not think much of Father Damien's vocation to priesthood. They basically thought that he was not smart enough to be a priest, but they finally decided to allow him to be ordained.

What surprised his superiors was that he asked to be sent to the leper colony of Kalaupapa on the island of Molokai. His brother was also a priest and he had become ill serving at the leper colony. Father Damien wanted to take his place.

When Father Damien arrived on the island, there were 600 lepers. Without doctors or nurses, Father Damien was the only one to give them comfort. He offered them religion, but also gave as much medical attention and comfort as he could. He dressed their sores, helped them build cottages, and went so far as to dig their graves and make their coffins.

The lepers responded to his sacrifice for them. Within six months, Father Damien had 400 catechumens. After 12 years, on April 15, 1889, Father Damien died of the disease as well. The last picture of him was as he lay dying on the floor with only a straw mattress, a pillow, and a single blanket to keep him warm.

For someone of whom little was Damien's expected. Father death was announced throughout the world and there was a National Day of Mourning throughout the Kingdom of Hawaii. He was canonized as a saint by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009. Saint Father Damien is the patron saint of lepers and of outcasts.

Father Damien's decision to go and serve the lepers of Molokai led him to die at the age of 49, however, by doing this, Father Damien imitated the healing Jesus came to offer. This is self-sacrifice which we are called to imitate as well in our lives.

Saint Father Damien shamed not only an island nation into helping its sick, but he also moved a world as well. As Lent approaches, let us remember to reach out to those who need healing. Let us make a 'leap' of faith in growing closer to God and praising Him in our lives.
