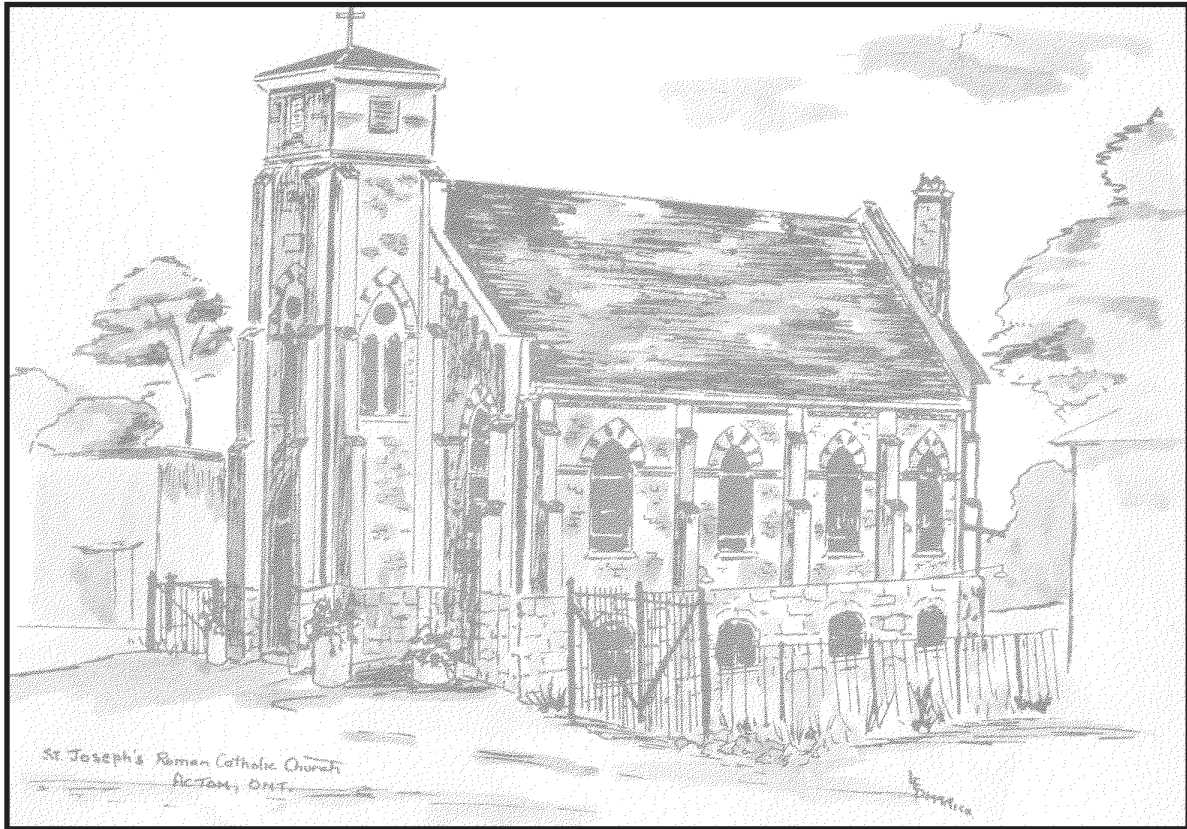

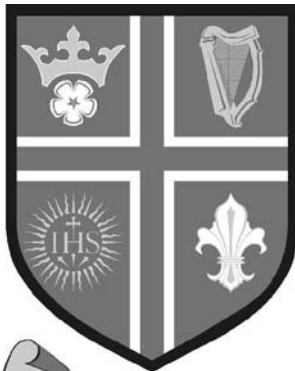

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

We come to the end of the Christmas Season with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This year we are fortunate because we are able to celebrate the full Christmas Season. If you recall, last year we celebrated the Epiphany of the Lord on Sunday, but the way the calendar was last year, this Feast was celebrated the very next day on Monday.

This Feast of The Baptism of Our Lord calls us to ponder the Christmas events which we celebrate and how they allow God to enter the world. The presence of God in the world was announced by angels to shepherds, those who needed God.

The Epiphany speaks to us of the star that guided the Magi to the Lord. The idea of the star invites us to look to the heavens as well, to seek God for ourselves. Today, on this Feast Day, we hear His voice in the world pointing us toward the presence of Christ.

The late Pope Benedict XVI in 2009 spoke of these events in an Epiphany homily of his: "These are all signs through which the Lord never tires of repeating: "Yes, I am here. I know you. And there is a path that rises from you to me."" God chose to become human like us, to become visible and tangible, to become personal, to make His presence among us something we can feel.

On this Feast Day of the Lord's Baptism, a question which is asked and pondered each year is, why did Jesus accept to be baptized by John? We believe in a baptism for the forgiveness of sin. Jesus had no sin.

One reason which we can explain is that Jesus' Baptism was a process to begin creating a new identity within His followers. Our identity would now be dependent on something new. Our identity would be found in the waters of Baptism.

Jesus' Baptism changed God's identity and introduced us into a personal relationship with Him. In waters of the Jordan, Jesus united Himself with us. Pope Benedict said that

"Baptism is, so to speak, the bridge (Jesus) built between Himself and us, the road on which He makes Himself accessible to us."

This Sunday, we are reminded of our identity through Baptism. We should ponder what the baptized look like so that we can begin to look like those pleasing to the Lord.

I also wish to take this opportunity to thank all the parishioners who gave me gifts at Christmas time. Thank you, you were very kind through your generosity and the kind words in your cards.
