A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ost of us do not remember our Baptisms. We were infants or young children. Many of us will have knowledge of our Baptisms through photos, videos or proof of a Baptismal Certificate.

For me personally, I have photos of my Baptism. There are photos of me with my parents, my sister, and my godparents. As I reflect on that day, I feel fortunate to have been able to celebrate both my parents' funerals as well as my Godmother's, my Godfather passed away while I was still in the seminary. These photos which I cherish are still precious because they tell the story of where I came from and who I am.

The question which begins the Baptismal Rite is: What names have you given your child? This question is posed to the parents. When they respond with the child's names, the child attains an identity and with the identity of the child, the identity of the parents is altered also.

Perhaps the question could be rephrased: What identity do you give your child and yourselves? With the names, a child will always know where he or she came from. Parents are no longer John and Mary. They are also now known as 'Robert's parents'. Parents of Robert's classmates will meet Mary and will ask her name, and she will reply; "I'm Robert's Mother." In naming their child, the parents name themselves and their families as well.

It has long been a question of why the sinless Jesus stepped into the water to receive Baptism by John. What we must realize is that what happened with Jesus' Baptism happens with every Baptism, identity is established, new realities are created.

Through His Baptism, God provided for us an identity for His Son and as with any parent, it changed God's identity as well. God was no longer to be seen as being distant or impersonal, rather, through the Baptism of Jesus, He becomes for us 'Father'. God has become personal for us.

As we come to the end of this Christmas season, we should ponder how the entry of God into the World has meaning for us. The presence of God in the World was announced by angels to shepherds, those who needed God. The Epiphany speaks to us of the star that guided the Magi to the Lord. The idea of the star invites us to look to the heavens as well, to seek God for ourselves. Today with the Baptism of His Son, we hear His voice in the World pointing us toward the presence of Christ.

Today we are reminded of our Baptism, but even beyond this we are given the chance to look at our very identity a chance to know who God is and who we are, a chance to take our name, which is Christian.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who gave me cards, gifts, and treats during this Christmas season. Thank you for your continuing support and your prayers towards me.
