A Word From Our Pastor:

The special seasons of the Church's liturgical year make up the 'Extraordinary Time' throughout the year. The vestments are either purple, white, or even red. It is perhaps sufficient to say that 'Extraordinary Time' is when the really special stuff of Jesus' life happens.

We have of course just celebrated two of these seasons, Advent, and Christmas. In just over four weeks we will begin to celebrate two more of these special seasons, Lent and then Easter.

After last weekend which in we celebrated the Epiphany of the Lord followed by the Baptism of the Lord, we began what the Church calls Ordinary Time. The priest will wear green on each of the 33 Sundays of Ordinary Time. During this period, the Church picks readings from the Gospels that will systematically take us through the teachings of Jesus. We began appropriately with the Baptism of the Lord the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. Today, still at the beginning of Ordinary Time, Jesus asks us a question that should remain with us through the rest of our year: "What are you looking for?"

Yes, this is a challenge to us. Indeed, what are we looking for? Why have we come here? The initial response of Andrew and the other disciple (who scholars say is St. John) to the question of Jesus was, on one level, a superficial response made by someone who doesn't quite know what to say: "Where are you staying?" On another level, it is a question with great depth. "Where can we find you, Jesus?" Through this Ordinary Time, and our ordinary daily life we will ask again and again, "Where can we find you Jesus? Where are you staying?"

Like watching people in the mall, John the Baptist pointed Jesus out to Andrew and His other disciple. The Gospel doesn't really say the statement was directed to the men. It could easily have been a remark made by John to no one in particular, yet it reveals what he thought of Jesus. What we must not fail to notice is that Jesus did not wait for them to catch up. Instead, He stopped and turned to them and initiated a relationship with the men. We must remember that He does the same with us throughout our lives.

This Gospel passage at the beginning of this Ordinary Time is about discipleship. It's about being called and about what discipleship means. Throughout this Ordinary Time, we will discover that there is a cost to discipleship. But if we come to know Jesus, it will be worth the cost.
