A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

he Feast of the Epiphany, which Egypt sometime originated in during the third century, predates our celebration Christmas. of Historically it celebrated the three Epiphanies or manifestations of Jesus' divinity: His birth, the adoration of the Magi, and His Baptism. Unlike the Eastern Catholic churches and the Orthodox churches, we in the west celebrate the three events individually.

A proper way that we can celebrate the Epiphany is to look at a memorial which we celebrate on January 3, the Most Holy Name of Jesus. This memorial greatly supplements and serves the Epiphany. You might say we see this with the identity of Christ being made known through His 'manifestation'. This was witnessed by the shepherds at the Birth of Christ, revered by the coming of the Magi, and pronounced by a voice from Heaven identifying Jesus as "My Beloved Son" at His Baptism.

What we can learn from the Epiphany and from the Feast of The Holy Name of Jesus, is how we are able to keep the name of Jesus holy in our lives. The image of the Magi helps us to achieve this. Something profound happened to the world that changed it and as priests they came to give praise. We are called to do the same in our lives.
