

A Word From Our Pastor:

his is the last week until Labour Day weekend in which we read from the Gospel of Mark. For the rest of the summer, we will be reading the Bread of Life Discourse from the Gospel of John, Chapter Six.

A number of weeks ago, the Fourth Sunday of Easter to be exact, we read of Jesus being the Good Shepherd and how He protects His flock. It is also the Sunday on which we were asked to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

I mentioned on that Sunday, how sheep need to be protected and watched over. One thing that I did not mention was that sheep are afraid of water, especially running water. Anyone who has ever been caught in the rain wearing a woolen coat knows how absorbent wool is and how incredibly heavy a waterlogged piece of clothing can become. Imagine then, if a sheep were to fall into water. The sheep would drown. Running water is entirely too dangerous, but 'still water', a lake or pond, is calm and there is not nearly as much likelihood that the sheep might be caught by a current and drown.

This image brings us to this Sunday's Psalm. The Psalm of course is said or sung between the two readings before the Gospel. The Psalm for this Sunday is Psalm 23, which is possibly the most loved of all the Psalms.

If it is not the most beloved, it is definitely the most well known of the Psalms. Many of us will have heard it during funeral liturgies. Some will have prayer cards or plaques detailing the almost poetic words of the Psalm. I personally use this Psalm often during baptisms. The words provide, in many ways, comfort and a trust in God's love and His protection.

The Psalm speaks of God as the shepherd who will guide His flock to green pastures in order that the sheep can eat and rest. The Good Shepherd will guide the flock to 'still waters' where sheep can drink without fear. This image of an anointed King serving as the Good Shepherd will become a messiannic prophecy until the coming of Jesus.

Last week we read how Jesus sent the Apostles out to preach, heal, and cast out demons in His name. In today's Gospel, we read that the Apostles have returned, and Jesus wishes to go with them to a place where they can "rest a while". This 'rest' means

to take the time to ponder all that has happened during the Apostles' missionary work. We would call this a retreat.

Unfortunately, the Apostles would not get their time to rest with Jesus. People had anticipated where Jesus was going and were waiting for Him and the Apostles at their "deserted place". However, we see a true Shepherd who springs into action. We see a Shepherd who cares more about His sheep than about His personal plans. The Apostles, although most likely tired and now probably frustrated, get a lesson in real preaching; the best preaching is not what we say but what we do.

This Sunday, we must come to understand what kind of shepherd Jesus is calling us to be in our lives. We must be shepherds who help to build God's Kingdom, not our own kingdom.




