A Word From Our Pastor:

his Sunday, we begin to read the 6th Chapter of the Gospel of Mark. In the previous Chapter 5, we see Jesus cast out a demon from a man. He then crosses the Sea of Galilee with the Apostles to return to the Jewish side, when, while underway, a storm threatens to sink their boat. Jesus ends the storm and calms the water.

Last Sunday we heard how the power of Jesus cured a woman who had suffered hemorrhaging for 12 years and how He raised a 12-year-old girl from the dead. All those around Jesus, including His Apostles, were amazed at what He had accomplished. They proclaimed the divine power which He possessed. This was the usual response to God's self-revelation.

Today, however, after all the displays of power which He showed to the people, He was dismissed as merely the son of a lowly carpenter.

Throughout our reading of Mark's Gospel so far, Mark has been asking the question, "Who is Jesus?". It is a question which we need to ask ourselves. How we react to Jesus, how well we listen to His words, how well we try to l9ve by His teaching, all depend on how we answer this question. Our answer will guide everything in our lives.

If we look at the people in Nazareth, they really knew Jesus, His family, and His friends. The town only numbered 300 people in the time of Jesus. Perhaps their familiarity made it impossible to accept His authority We can surmise that the people were jealous or resentful of what Jesus had accomplished and how others had praised Him. Just their response of "Where did the carpenter's son get all of this?", says a lot about their reaction to Him.

Whatever reason led the people of Nazareth to dismiss Jesus, Mark tells us that because of their lack of acceptance, Jesus was rendered powerless. The powerlessness of Jesus spoken of by Mark is not saying anything about what God can and cannot do. Rather, this story is primarily about those who stand in the way of things good and holy. Not only can someone be blocking themselves from God's power, but they might also be thwarting His ability to work miracles for others as well.

How many families bring a child for Baptism, then never follow through on their promise to raise their children in the practice of the faith? How about a couple who desire to be married in a church but really do not desire to be married in the Church? Finally, how many will state a belief in the Eucharist, but rarely show up? These are only a few of the questions one can ponder when they are considering who Jesus is in their lives.

This Sunday, we are called to see "who is Jesus" in our lives. We must see that Jesus is someone who we adore, instead of just admiring from a distance.

This weekend we observe Mission Co-op Sunday, and are blessed to welcome Father Frank Wagner, who is a priest of the Holy Cross Fathers. Father Wagner will be preaching at this weekend's Masses. He was Pastor of St Raphael's Parish in Burlington from 2015 to 2017, and currently resides in Montreal. Soon, Father Wagner will relocate to Welland to serve in a parish staffed by the Holy Cross Fathers. We pray for and welcome Father Wagner to St. Joseph Patron of Canada Parish.
