

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. There is confusion on this Solemnity for many people.

Some people were raised with the belief that this Solemnity was celebrated on the Thursday before this Sunday, hence, it was known as "Ascension Thursday". Some dioceses, especially in the United States, still celebrate it on the Thursday. In Canada, it was moved to the Sunday many years ago.

If one were to celebrate the Ascension on the Thursday, they would recognize that it is exactly 40 days since Easter. Many will believe that this is still the proper way to celebrate this Solemnity.

The Thursday before this Sunday, in itself, has no particular significance. As I mentioned earlier, it is exactly 40 days since Easter. In the passage from Acts today, Luke tells us that Jesus continued to appear to the disciples for 40 days, however, Luke never intended to imply that Jesus remained for this specific amount of time following His resurrection. The Scriptures rely heavily on symbols to make a point, and the number 40 has its own meaning.

The number 40 is used to represent a considerable amount of time when knowing the exact amount of time is unimportant. The number 40 was also used to represent an amount of time that was long enough in which to accomplish a specific task, to see the task through to its completion.

One may notice that the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles are in a disagreement with each other over the time between the Resurrection and the Ascension, even though both books were written by Luke at the same time.

In the Gospel, Jesus rises from the dead, appears to the disciples, and ascends to the Father, all on the same day, but in Acts, there are 40 days between the Resurrection and the Ascension. Luke's readers had strayed from the point of the Resurrection and the Ascension, and he had to redirect them.

Luke is telling two stories. In the Gospel, the story is of Jesus Christ. In Acts, the story is of the formation of the Christian community, the Church. Both versions are told to help the community understand the transition from the life of

Jesus to the life of the Church. Both stories are told to emphasize Jesus' ongoing presence.

Luke is also telling us about the dawn of the Kingdom of God. Many early believers in the Church thought that after Jesus' resurrection, He would come again very shortly afterwards in power and glory. Luke's community was very caught up in the timetable of this return. Luke had to help his readers finally grasp that God's Kingdom was not earthly. The exact time of Jesus' return to us is unimportant. What is important is that we are still in a time of transition. Jesus has us working for the Kingdom, and He has sent the Spirit to aid us in the mission which we have been given. The return will occur when it occurs. What is important is that we prepare for it.

As we come closer to the end of this Easter Season, we must remember that the '40 days' are not important. What is important is that Jesus is still with us.
