# A Word From Our Pastor:

his weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and blood of Christ. Many of us would know it by its other name, Corpus Christi.

There are two saints who we will talk about in this message pertaining to this Solemnity. One is one of the most famous Saints in our Church's history. Tho other is very obscure but is still important in teaching the holiness and significance of Corpus Christi.

The more obscure Saint is St. Juliana of Liège. She was an Augustinian Nun, who lived in the 12<sup>th</sup> Century in what is now know as Belgium. She was an immensely talented woman and scholar who through her devotion and faithfulness was able to teach that the bread and wine presented at Mass becomes the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. Until St. Juliana's time, the Body of Christ was not elevated after the Consecration. Her Eucharistic devotion became a movement that drove the desire of Medieval Catholics to want to see the Body of Christ, so the elevation of the host began in France around 1220. Also, Adoration became a regular practice.

The famous Saint we will talk about is St. Thomas Aquinas. St. Thomas was one of the greatest minds in Church history. He is a Doctor of the Church, and his writings are still taught to this day.

We can see the influence of St. Thomas today in our solemnity through what we call the Sequence of the Mass. When we see a Sequence during the Mass, we are reminded that the Church is pointing us to something essential in our faith. We had a Sequence on Pentecost Sunday and on Easter Sunday.

A Sequence is optional during Mass. It should always be sung by a very talented choir. I must admit, in my time as a priest, I have only heard a Sequence sung perhaps five times. If you wish to read and pray the Sequence for Corpus Christi, it starts on page 411 in the Sunday Missal.

This brings us to St. Thomas today. The Sequence for this Sunday has its origins in a

hymn written by St. Thomas. Its original name in Latin was 'Laude Sion' meaning 'Praise, O Sion'. He wrote it specifically for the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, in about the year 1264. The 10<sup>th</sup> verse truly teaches us what the Feast is all about.

This Feast today celebrates the gift Jesus gave us, His Body and Blood, but despite all the teachings which have been given to us, many still do not completely understand the depth and profundity of this precious gift. Through the Body and Blood of Christ, we are allowed to share in the life of God. This is the perfect sacrifice. It is the perfect act of love.
