

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

his Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. Many of us would recognize it by its other title, Corpus Christi. Whatever name or title we use, we need to ponder and profess the significance of the Eucharist.

Perhaps some of you have participated in a Corpus Christi procession over the years. They are not as popular as they were in previous times. Father Duffy at the Basilica in Guelph is having a procession this afternoon. I wish I could attend but I have prior commitments today.

My first participation in a procession was at St. Mary's Church in Hamilton in 1989. I, and a couple of other Seminarians, helped Bishop Ustrzycki on that day.

My first experience as a priest with a procession was in 1998 at St. Mary's in Brantford. Once again, Bishop Ustrzycki was present to lead the procession. What I remember about that procession was that it was extremely hot and it was a very long procession. We travelled numerous blocks throughout Brantford. Everyone showed great reverence and faith throughout that procession. It was also m first weekend at St. Mary's as the associate. I always felt sorry for Bishop Ustrzycki on that day because of the heat.

Corpus Christi has gone through many changes, but its origin allows us to ask some questions of ourselves. In the first centuries of the Church, there was a question about whether the Eucharist was the "real presence" of Christ or merely a "symbolic presence". This feast was in part a response to this question. It emphasized that we believe that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist.

As the Church moved into the Middle Ages, receiving Communion became very infrequent. People became afraid of God. With plagues, wars, short life spans, and hardships, God was seen as "The Judge.'" Our Church precept that mandates receiving Holy Communion at least once during the Easter Season is a holdover from those days.

Today, we see quite the opposite. Now many are so casual in their relationship with God that they take God for granted. One's relationship with Mass is no different. Many see attending Sunday Mass as being just one option available to them on a Sunday.

We need to recognize that this Feast Day is connected to Holy Thursday. Both invite us to once again examine our relationship with the Eucharist. It is an annual challenge to examine our motivation, our behaviours, and our gestures. We say we believe that we stand in the very presence of God at our altar. This is a good time to let the impact of that belief to sink in once more.

The solemnity of the Holy Trinity is a celebration of the abundance of God's love. It is an occasion for appreciating what God has done for us and continues to do for us. It calls us to respond to the love of God, which is poured into our hearts by Christ and the Holy Spirit.
