# A Word From Our Pastor:

hough we do not use the word often, most of us know that the nave of the church is the section in which the congregation sits. The word 'nave' comes from the Latin word meaning 'ship' thus our word 'navy' originates from this word as well.

One of the earliest symbols of the Church was a ship, especially of one in rough seas. Here at St. Joseph's, one of our stainedglass windows depicts this image. The Gospel passage for this Sunday from Mark also depicts Jesus and His Apostles in a boat and facing rough seas.

Mark's words encourage us to be faithful even when it looks as though chaos will win the day. It calls to mind many passages from the Old Testament, and among these passages, many would have been reminded of Creation.

An image like "A mighty wind swept the waters" is mentioned in both Genesis and in today's Gospel passage from Mark. It can be described as being like a tornado-like windstorm, so we know that the Disciples were frightened at what was happening to them.

What we may notice is that throughout the storm, Jesus was asleep. This sleep is important because it was an untroubled sleep. Jesus was sleeping, comfortably and unconcerned. The Scriptures show us this kind of sleep when they want to speak of an individual's absolute conviction in the saving power of God. Jesus could sleep well despite the storm because of His unwavering faith in the power of God.

In the creation stories from the Old Testament, water had represented chaos. In today's Gospel passage, the storm, with water filling the wind-tossed boat has once again caused chaos, but Jesus, standing tall, commanded the chaos to end.

On this Sunday we are given encouragement. Jesus calls us to "Be not afraid". Yes, in a storm, waves do wash into the boat, but God is there with us. Even if we think God is asleep and not paying attention, He is still there. We must remember that whether waking or sleeping, God is in control.
