# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

oday we interrupt the usual liturgical cycle by celebrating the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. I looked up some previous years and I learned that we have not celebrated this Solemnity since 2014. We would have celebrated it in 2020 but of course that was a leap year, so the celebration was omitted that year.

We think of Peter and Paul as giants in the Faith, which they are, but we forget that they were only human. They had far less than we have today, far fewer resources, difficulty in traveling and, in some cases, extreme prejudice working against them. What they did have, but many lack, was an intense love of Jesus Christ and a deep conviction that Jesus stood with them.

We have the knowledge that Peter was a commercial fisherman, perhaps in business with Andrew and the two sons of Zebedee, James and John. The scriptures reveal to us that Peter was highly regarded by the rest of the disciples as his name is usually the first mentioned in any story or list. We also know that he was impulsive, spoke out of turn, that his eagerness led him to go too far at times, and that he vehemently denied his association with Jesus.

Paul was the opposite of Peter. He was born into a wealthy family in the city of Tarsus. He was able to speak Greek and as a young man had an interest in ministry and religious law. Paul loved to please, and to please his elders who were Pharisees, he helped persecute early members of the Church. He was present at the death of the first martyr, Stephen. Evidently Paul was very good at persecution because he was feared by the followers of Christ.

Both men ended up shaping and spreading faith in Jesus. They knew each other, but we can probably read between the lines that they did not always get along with one another. Many in the early Church did not trust Paul because of his earlier persecutions of Christians. Paul also saw Peter as being weak, but they recognized each other's faith, and they managed to find respect and admiration for one another. One might say they became a team in spreading the Faith.

Peter's conviction allowed him to overcome betrayal. His over enthusiasm became his ally, not his downfall. In the final moments of his life, he did not deny knowing Jesus, but rather he put his trust in Christ, and for this he gave up his life. Paul, on the other hand, was able to 'think outside the box'. Having been an insider's insider among the Pharisees, Paul managed to drop the wall he had formed. Once Paul's personal barriers fell, he could help others take down theirs. He was able to convince others to accept Gentiles into the community.

On their Solemnity, we can see that the examples of Peter and Paul's lives can show us a path to advance the faith as well. All that is required is that we work together as a team and trust that Jesus stands with us.
