A Word From Our Pastor:

T is hard to believe that we are at the second weekend of May the month of May is usually very busy for priests. Many parishes will be celebrating First Holy Communions and Confirmations. This is also the beginning of the season for celebrating weddings in a parish as well.

As Catholics we also set aside the month of May as being a month in which we honour our Blessed Mother, Mary in a special way. With this in mind, we also honour mother both living and deceased on Mothers' Day (May 12).

We honour Mothers on this day by the fact that they give us life. For the most part, our mothers were the first ones to instill a faith life or faith practices in us. We pray the mothers will always be strengthened by the image of the Blessed Mother in their lives. I am always comforted by the Gospel passage of the Wedding of Can, which was the first public miracle of Jesus. We are reminded of the words spoken by Mary at the wedding. She told the servants: "Do whatever He asks you."

A mother, if her own faith life is important to her, would encourage her children to follow this example by listening to Our Lord. Of all the mothers that are out there, there is one group of mothers who stand distinct. Their role is prominent and unique, but I have never seen published rules of etiquette for them. They hold a place of prominence but there is no rite of initiation for them to assume the role. I'm speaking of the mothers of priests.

Some mothers of priests fulfill the role not knowing they are doing it. Some fulfill the role so naturally it is as if they were destined for it.

All priests have mothers. Unfortunately, I know of some colleagues in the priesthood whose mothers died before they were even ordained, and never had the opportunity to enjoy the role for themselves. I was very blessed to have my mother present at my ordination, even though she was ill at the time, in fact she was in the hospital a few days after my ordination.

I can always remember, while being in the seminary, that I attended the funeral of a priest's mother. I was home for the summer and as I sat there, I kept wondering how the priest could possibly manage to celebrate his own mother's funeral. At that stage of my formation, I could not imagine doing this once I was allowed to be ordained. Of course, I had this opportunity when my own mother died a number of years after my ordination. remember being told that celebrating her Funeral Mass would be a wonderful opportunity for me to show my love and respect for my mother. It was a great example of returning the faith practices she had instilled in me as a young child.

On this Mothers' Day, let us pray for all mothers on their special day. Especially deceased mothers who we pray have received God's eternal blessings.
