A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

hroughout this Season of Easter, we will be reading from the Book of Revelation for the second readings on Sundays.

The Book of Revelation is a fantastic book of Scripture which brings many interpretations. Many see Revelation as being a book of 'doom and gloom'. Some saw Revelation as being proper for the end of time as we began the new century in the year 2000. Yes, there are certainly some fantastic visions and statements in the book. Unfortunately, ignorance of Revelation leads to a most un-Christian response to hardships.

Revelation is a book written by a man named John to a very specific group of Christian communities in what is now Western Turkiye. Some scholars feel that John is the Apostle John, the only Apostle not to have been martyred. Others feel that the author is a disciple of John. Whatever the case may be, the text is basically detailing his diary.

A theme throughout the book is that the authorities do not understand Christianity. They are also afraid of it, viewing it as being a subversive cult. With this world situation in mind, John has been banished to an island called Patmos. The writer encourages these early communities to keep responding to their faith and to endure.

When we think of enduring something, we think of simply putting up with something for a while. For John, endurance is more than just putting up with something, he saw it as being a virtue. It is the virtue of staying loyal despite every reason not to. Endurance is not just lasting through a hardship; it is thriving despite hardship. This is the call of Revelation, to stay loyal to our faith, to thrive in it. This is the response of a believer.

While John's words can be frightening they can also be words of hope. He writes of God's ultimate triumph for those who choose to endure. Revelation was written to people in Turkiye who found themselves struggling. The initial burst of enthusiasm of the early Christians had faded. The followers were now trying to define themselves and to develop creeds to profess as a faith. It was a minority religion, distrusted and without credibility. Still, John wrote words of encouragement and support. In the passage for this Sunday, we see the fantastic image of the Lion and the Lamb. It is a contradiction; many would see the Lion as being powerful and strong. Not so the Lamb. John is saying that nothing exists apart from God. Obviously, the Lamb is Jesus, and it is through Him that all of us can come together under God's love. Association with Jesus is our goal, however, there is a task to be undertaken. It is to build the Kingdom of God.

The Book of Revelation is a book which can bring us hope to strive and to endure in our lives. We are connected to Christ, and we must not be afraid.
