## A Word From Our Pastor:

ne of my favourite actors of all time is Ronald Coleman who appeared in movies from the 1920's to the 1950's. He possessed a refined English accent which made him very popular with movie audiences. With his debonair style, he was often cast in historical dramas. One of these was the 1935 version of *A Tale of Two Cities* which was based on the Charles Dickens novel from the 1800's.

The story is set in the turbulent time of the French Revolution. Ronald Coleman played the character of Sidney Carton who is in love with his friend's wife. In a twist of circumstances, the Carton character must make a choice. He chooses to trade places with his friend, so that his friend can be reunited with his wife. This switch means that Carton will face execution by the guillotine.

As he is being led to the guillotine, the Carton character utters this famous quote: "It is a far, far better thing that I do, than I have ever done; it is a far, far better rest that I go to, than I have ever known." In the movie, the camera then pans away from the guillotine and focusses on the sky. With Ronald Coleman's rich voice, these words have a very haunting tone to them.

In this Sunday's Gospel we are asked: "how does Jesus love us?" In his Gospel, John uses the word 'love' no fewer than nine times to remind us of the central command of our Christian Faith: 'love one another as I love you.'

This love which Jesus gives us, can be seen in a word which was expressed by Him in in last week's Gospel about the true vine. The word is 'abide'. In our lives, we can live somewhere, we can stay somewhere, we can remain somewhere. Each of these phrases speaks of being in a certain place, but none of them speak of permanence or intimacy. To 'abide' with someone denotes such intimacy with that person that we have chosen to remain together permanently.

To abide with a person is to become so intertwined with love that separation is no longer possible. Jesus has chosen to abide with us. With this in mind, we must remember that He chose us first!

In our Gospel passage, John describes love by using the word 'agape'. John uses this word as being a choice one makes to love someone. It is not a feeling, but rather, it is an attitude with a sense of activity about it. More than a feeling, agape is doing. It is an attitude toward someone that means that despite how I might 'feel' about them, I still choose an attitude of care and concern. It is a love that is active, that wishes well, that reaches out and is a love that is sacrificial.

In two weeks, we will celebrate Pentecost. On that Sunday, we celebrate God's abiding love for us. We are to love Jesus as He has loved us. His love was so powerful, that it included a willingness to lay down His life for us.

Charles Dickens could not have chosen finer words than he did for the end of his novel. Jesus' love is a far, far better love in which we can share.
