# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

oday's Gospel from Mark finishes the final section of the presentation of Jesus's public ministry. For the last several weeks we have read of Jesus speaking in and around the Temple and about people's reaction to Him.

In this final passage of the section, Jesus criticizes those Scribes who have failed to put the Word into the context of God's justice. To emphasize this condemnation, in the next section of Mark's Gospel, Jesus will speak about how He is going to destroy the Temple and build a truly Holy Kingdom. This is the Kingdom we will be celebrating in two weeks with the Feast of Christ the King.

Perhaps it is important to recognize where this passage takes place in the Gospel. It takes place in the Court of Women where there were 13 trumpet shaped containers set up to collect donations for the upkeep of the Temple. The shape of these containers guaranteed that coins would make a loud sound when dropped into them.

This let everyone in the Temple know how much and individual had just given. The louder the sound, the more honour the donor gained. The two small coins probably used by the widow were called 'lepta". Being copper and the smallest coin in use, it would have made very little noise when dropped in a container.

It might be surprising to learn that Jesus is not praising this widow for her gift, but rather, is criticizing the crowd and the Scribes in particular. Jesus was upset that they had forsaken the care of the widows and orphans for the care of the Temple. He is clearly taking them down a notch in many ways.

Jesus also saw the wealthy contributing from their surplus towards the Temple. The contributions were probably large, but it didn't change their lives or lifestyles a bit. However, the widow 'gave', in a sense. She gave her all to the Lord. She gave not in despair, but with a sense of trust.

This is the type of giving that builds the Kingdom. Making contributions builds church

buildings, but giving of our means builds the Church.

The Feast of Christ the King is just two weeks away. We will celebrate something that has not yet occurred, the fullness of the Kingdom of God. Jesus' Kingdom is about serving God. We do this through the way we love God and by the way we utilize our resources. Today's Gospel makes us ask if we are properly motivated to give not just financially, but at the whole of our giving.
