A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

s we come near the end of this liturgical year, we are once again faced with readings which depict the end of time.

The Gospel this Sunday reminds us of the truth that the gifts of God are not ours to dispense with as we please. Neither does it suffice to hide them away leave them unused or allow them to wither. As Catholics, we are in the business of sharing the Kingdom of God. Christ came to serve, and our service to others helps us to grow in His image and likeness. Whatever our gifts happen to be, and we all have a variety, we are expected to make full use of them for God's glory. This is a call to be energetic in living the Gospel.

We must be careful with the word talent in this parable. A 'talent' cannot be equated with what we call talents today. To understand the gravity of Jesus' message, we must understand that a 'talent' in Jesus' culture was a monetary denomination, equal to about 6000 denarii. A denarius was roughly one day's wage; therefore, a talent was the equivalent of somewhere between 16 and 20 years worth of wages. Even the servant who received only one talent was given a huge responsibility.

We may find ourselves rolling our eyes at the third man's decision to bury the talent he was given. We shouldn't. This was an accepted practice protected by law. If you were given a person's valuables to protect, and if you buried them in a deep hole, then you were freed from any responsibility for these valueless. If they disappeared or were stolen, you were blameless. On the other hand, if you invested another person's money or valuables, you remained responsible for that amount for the rest of your life!

As usual, Jesus' parable turns expectations upside down. Jesus in no way intended to applaud immoral behavior, but He did wish to point out that the servants were to be admired for imitating their master. Their master was a risk taker, and so the master rewarded the servants' risk-taking while punishing the one who had played life too safely.

This gospel is a continuation of last week's gospel about the second coming. In today's passage, Jesus is teaching us about how to live as we await God's Kingdom. We are to imitate our Master. We are to take risks with the faith with which Jesus has entrusted us, investing it so that God's Kingdom will grow.

Next Sunday, on the Feast of Christ the King, we will celebrate the second coming of Christ. As followers of God, what will we have to show for all that has been entrusted to us? Will we have been so safe that our faith accomplished nothing, or will we show a return on our investment?
