A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

his weekend, the Church year draws to a close on a sombre note with a Gospel scene from Good Friday. One might wonder why the Church would choose a Gospel passage like this for the Feast of Christ the King, but we must remind ourselves that Christ is a King who rules from the Cross unlike earthly kings who rule from palaces. His Kingdom is not a place, but rather, a people who give their hearts lovingly to Him by shaping their lives according to His will. All that is good and elevated in our human nature flows from Calvary where He became Saviour of the World and won for us a life of eternal joy with God.

The Feast of Christ the King provides an excellent opportunity to review the quality of our Christian commitment. What effort have we been making to allow Christ's Kingdom to come alive in our hearts and in our community? Jesus is calling us to rise above the basic instincts of selfishness, bitterness, and pride to pledge our lives in this service because it is God's world although we might not think so now. In our better moments we realize Christ is the way. The effort invested in rising above a worldly level of behaviour does not come easily and brings us no end of trouble and frustration.

The Gospel of John offers us a picture of how things should really be. Pilate is obviously disturbed, clearly under pressure, a victim of indecision, but anxious to avoid trouble. Jesus, standing before Pilate, was aware of the man's brutality and ruthlessness. Jesus was also aware that Pilate did believe Him to be an innocent man. This could have been used by Jesus to His own advantage if he had only been willing to back off just a little. This was not the way of Jesus. He decided to take a stand against Pilate and therefore, against the Empire itself. His stand against Pilate demonstrates real Kingship.

Today we celebrate a point in time yet to come – the end of time. It will be marked by the coming of Jesus Christ in power and glory. Though that is a day to come, we are also reminded that He is King now. This knowledge and this faith can give us the courage to stand up to the Pilates in our lives. We must remember who we really serve. Jesus sacrificed everything to stand up for the Father. This is our example, our call, and our courage.
