# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

e have entered the month of November whare we are called to pray for the deceased throughout the entire month.

The Church provides during the month, special and holy Feast Days for Catholics to pray for the dead. One is All Saints' Day on November 1<sup>st</sup>, followed by All Souls' Day on November 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Church also ponders Remembrance Day when we pray for those who gave their lives, and we also pray for peace. Many parishes will have special masses on this day. Regarding All Saints' and All Souls', the Church invites us to ponder Heaven on the 1<sup>st</sup> and then invites us to ponder Purgatory on the 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Honouring the dead and rituals that accompany them allows a lot of emotions to be revealed. The Catholic Church does not have a monopoly on honouring the dead. Most religions and cultures have their customs and rituals to pay final respect to the dead. Our Jewish friends in particular have a period of seven days of mourning in which family members assemble to receive visitors after the burial.

Even in Sacred Scripture there are images of the sacredness of burial. Moses' burial is mentioned in the Book of Deuteronomy. Abraham's wife, Sarah, is the first person whose burial is mentioned in Scripture, as well as the first account of the purchase of a grave plot.

The stories of tombs and cemeteries in the New Testament are also shown. We have Lazarus being called by Jesus from out of his tomb after four days. There is also Joseph of Arimathea who gave his own tomb hewn from a rock, for Christ's burial. The Church has also devoted the last Station of the Cross to the laying of Jesus in that tomb.

Tombs, graves, and burial sites need to be seen as sacred places. How often have we seen foreign dignitaries, when visiting a country, being asked to lay wreaths at a tomb of an unknown soldier. Thousands will visit the burial places of famous people. We, as Catholics, have opportunities to visit shrines of holy, venerated, Saints throughout the world.

With such a rich tradition both spiritually and respectfully, it is no wonder that 'burying the dead' is a corporal work of mercy in our Catholic tradition. It is seen as a basic human function, just like eating and drinking. Listing 'burying the dead' with other basic human rights of the living speaks loudly about where the Church ranks this corporal work. The Church has always championed the rights of people while they live, it is no wonder that she does the same for people in death.

As we begin this November, let us be reminded that not only do we pray for those who we know and love, but we also pray for all who have gone before us. Our Christian responsibility is to pray for each other, the living and the dead.
