

#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

e begin a new liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent. We will be reading from the Gospel of Matthew for most Sundays throughout the year.

Matthew wrote for a Christian community whose members were primarily converts from Judaism in and around Jerusalem. During the time of the Gospel being written, the followers had seen the Roman-Jewish war which led to the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem. This led to the Christians being forced out of the synagogues and the start of persecution of the group.

Matthew's community was also being ridiculed for its belief that Jesus would return. After all these years, where was He? For many, this belief became an embarrassment, and this led many to abandon their faith. Thus, we have Matthew's passage today.

The community had seen the destruction of the Temple, many had died, and Christ seemed not to be coming. In our Gospel passage this Sunday, Matthew reminds the community that Christ will return because He promised He would. Jesus did not lie. We misunderstood. Even Jesus Himself said, "No one knows the day nor the hour. Only the Father knows that".

We are reminded today that we inherit and share this faith. Jesus is going to come again. On this First Sunday of Advent, we are called to remember once more that "we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ".

With this being the First Sunday of our new liturgical year, we once again will explore the coming of the Lord, His life and teaching, His Passion, Death, and Resurrection, and remember His promise to return. What this season of Advent gives us is a chance to start over on that journey, to renew ourselves and once again make ourselves ready. We do this through our preparations for Christmas.

In preparing to celebrate the moment of His first coming, we are actually honing our preparations for His Second Coming. The celebration of Christmas, the Feast of the Incarnation, is not just a celebration of what has already happened, you might say that it is a rehearsal for that day when Christ will come again.

As we begin this season of Advent, we have an opportunity to start again. Today, the past year does not matter. Today is the start of a new liturgical year, the beginning of the pilgrimage once more.

We look toward to Christmas for a vision of our future and in preparing for another Christmas, we have that chance to live life differently this year so that we will be ready for when He comes again.


