A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ith this being Thanksgiving weekend, it is very appropriate that the reading involve a sense of thanksgiving and gratitude.

Naaman, from our First Reading and the Samaritan from the Gospel, were both cured from leprosy, however; they had other strikes against them as well. Both were outcasts, not wanted in the community. What we must see is that the real cure was not simply freedom from ailments, but rather an end to isolation. Both individuals were able to find a place within the community. Naaman came to worship the Lord of Israel, and the Samaritan came to be a member of the community of believers.

The image of gratitude is very important in the story of these two men which goes beyond the cures that we witness in our reading today. Gratitude to God is something very short in supply in the modern world and yet the response of gratitude is part of the focus of each reading. Gratitude is something we must find within ourselves and give expression to.

Naaman's act of humble submission to Elisha's command, a difficult thing for a military commander, to wash in the Jordan, not only brought Naaman healing, but it also brought conversion. Naaman begged for soil from Israel, because it was believed that a sacrifice to a god can only be performed in the land of the god. Naaman, needing to return to Syria, took earth with him so that he could appropriately give thanks to the God of Israel. His gratitude also went beyond the miracle. He was grateful for discovering a God that was real.

The Samaritan was not only healed, but he was also converted. His faith in Jesus' command was his salvation. The Samaritan returned in gratitude not only because he had been healed, but because he also came to believe. The other nine, no doubt pleased about their new circumstance, certainly appreciated the miracle, but it changed nothing in their faith. Jesus took the opportunity of the occasion to point out this failure of the other nine.

We must recognize that the mark of conversion to the Lord is gratitude. Today we are asked to examine how we might be showing our gratitude to God. A lack of gratitude implies a lack of faith, or at

least a lack of committed faith. The question of gratitude is, therefore, very important to us.

On this Thanksgiving, we are called to return and give thanks to God, to what He has given to us. Outward signs of gratitude are a profound way of both finding and increasing faith. The more we live with thankfulness on our lips, the more we learn to see the blessing of faith. It took outsiders like Naaman and the Samaritan to recognize God's real gift, faith. We must be careful to not take this gift for granted.
