# **A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:**

ne of the most difficult moments in a family's life is making the decision for an elderly parent about when it is time to move out of the family home and into assisted care or nursing care. Leaving a home after many years and many memories is very difficult, even traumatic for the family member.

Believe it or not, a priest can be just as adamant as a parent when it comes to moving to assisted living. Many priests are very independent and have lived on their own in many cases.

I was reading of a 92-year-old priest who had been living on his own in an apartment since he retires from active ministry. Finally, his bishop convinced him to move to an assisted care living residence. The priest stated the "Thy will be done."

The "Thy will" was not referring to his bishop. This priest knew that he was approaching the final phase of life. When asked what had changed his mind, he responded, "God's moves for us always take us to better places. My next real move is to Heaven. I don't need my apartment to get ready."

This weekend both the First Reading from Isaiah and the Gospel from Matthew are eschatological in nature. Eschatology is the branch of theology that deals with what we might call the 'last things' or the end of time. For us this weekend we are asked how we can get thinking about God and Heaven as we deal with the lives which we live.

This Gospel should cause us to pause and think about the wonderful future that is within our reach. It teaches us that God is longing for our homecoming in the next world. Meanwhile, the one thing necessary is to make sure that we will arrive safely by responding to His love. We are never nearer to this love than when we come forward at Mass to receive the Body of Christ in Holy Communion, and in our daily lives when we have the opportunities to share in Christ's life. As we ponder our lives and the invitation to live with God, which we have received, do we insist on following God on our own terms, or do we accept the terms offered by Jesus? This is the reason why the guest was thrown out of the banquet hall, not because of what he was wearing but rather, he wanted God on his own personal terms.

To accept the terms of Jesus requires sacrificial love, the kind Jesus demonstrated when He gave up His life for us. Mercifully, Jesus showed us that keeping our eyes fixed on something far beyond ourselves can help us persevere through anything.
