

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

hen the Church introduced the revised Roman Missal in 2011 there were numerous changes to wording we use at Mass. The late Pope Benedict XVI wanted the New Missal to offer a clearer understanding of what the Mass should be for us both as a Church and as Catholics. The Holy Father desired for the same Mass to be celebrated throughout the Church's world. Yes, it may be celebrated in different languages throughout the world, but it still has the reverence, faithfulness, and the beauty it has had throughout the centuries. The Paschal memorial of Christ must always be the centre of our worship.

This Sunday's Gospel gives us an opportunity to study a change in the wording of one of the Eucharistic Prayers in the Missal. The Second Eucharistic Prayer is the shortest of the Eucharistic Prayers, but it is used a lot by celebrants.

With the previous Missal, the phrase "We thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you." Was said by the priest right after the memorial acclamation. Today, with the New Missal, the passage is still in the same location of the prayer, but the wording is different. It goes like this: "giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you."

The major difference is between the words 'to serve' and 'to minister to you'. To serve is a very broad statement. It does not need to be seen in a religious context. One can serve by helping others especially when they are in distress.

To 'minister to you' is very specific in nature. It is seen in serving God and Christ. However, it must also be seen with the attitude that we are returning in thanksgiving what God has given us in our lives.

Luke, in his Gospel is showing us how we are expected to act towards God. It was expected, and it was the purpose of servants and slaves, to serve. They were neither paid nor rewarded. Luke is in no way endorsing nor condemning the social practices of his time. Luke is contrasting this image to the one we are called to live by. Yes, we are to serve God, but with a deeper understanding of what He has already offered to us. We have His Son and have been graced by the Holy Spirit. This gives us an opportunity to both serve

in a generous way but also in a way which pleases God and motivates us to be good.

This weekend we need to see that we exist to love Him and to serve Him. This must never be seen in a demeaning way. We are called to imitate Christ, who served His Father to the point of giving up His life.


