A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

First of all, I wish all of you and your families a blessed and Holy Thanksgiving. Let us be reminded of the blessing which God has provided for us and may we always be thankful for the gift of His Son, Jesus.

The Gospel of this Sunday is very appropriate for the Thanksgiving weekend. In it, we have images of bearing fruit, harvesting, vineyards and gratitude. Another image which we may not see immediately, is that of stewardship. This parable is about giving what is due and about practicing justice.

The landlord is just like the one from the Gospel of two weeks ago who went beyond the usual ownership of the vineyard. This landlord planted the vineyard and planted a hedge around it to protect it from thieves and animals. He dug a winepress and built a tower so a watchman could look for intruders.

Usually a landlord would say, "Here's the land. You put on it what you need to. I'll be back to collect the rent later." This landlord was very different. He provided for everything. All the tenants had to do was care for the wines and then gather the harvest.

The tenants could not even do this for the landlord. They had become ungrateful for his work and care for them. We must always remember that God's ways are different from what we usually expect.

What we must recognize is that Matthew is not speaking of destroying the vineyard, which a lot of people at that time would have expected Matthew to say. Rather, he speaks of not destroying but of starting over, telling us of an owner (God) who has a history of trying over and over to renew His relationship with us after each on of our failures.

This parable challenges us to keep working is God's service and not become complacent. We can disappoint our Lord when we sit back and fail to appreciate the beauty of our lives, the joy of our families, and His loving care. Christ is concerned that we respond to His appeal to bear fruit and become an immense and beautiful harvest.

Once again, blessings to all on this Thanksgiving weekend.
