

#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ould you accept money for something good if you knew the money being given to you was earned in dubious ways?

Most of us will never have this experience, but there is a story from Hamilton Diocese when this specific question came about. When I was in the seminary, I was told by a priest from our Diocese who is now deceased, of the building of a new church in the Diocese.

The priest told me that the Diocese was approached by a gentleman who was terminally ill. He had been away from the Church for many years, but he wanted to make amends as he was dying. This priest told me that the man had earned his wealth through illegal ways.

I was later told by others that the Diocese firmly rejected the offer, while others have said that the Diocese accepted a small sum from the individual. Whatever the case may be, there is a moral question pertaining to this issue.

This leads to the parable of the Gospel this Sunday. It seems to be a little awkward since it seems to approve of dishonesty about the mismanagement of wealth. Stewards were entrusted to watch over the rest of the household servants and the master's property. This steward was in a crisis either because of dishonesty or mismanagement, for which he was to be fired.

The morality of the situation is not the concern of Jesus as He tells the story. His concern is about the man's ability to respond to a crisis. The way the steward tried to ingratiate himself to others by lowering their debt so he would have a future somewhere else was considered a noble thing. Dishonesty was not noble, but the ability to use possessions for the sake of your future was.

This Gospel parable lets us know that how we use wealth has eternal consequences. Jesus wants His followers to learn from the world. Even though wealth can be dangerous, it is still possible to manage wealth and possessions in ways that serve the Kingdom of God.

As followers of Jesus, we are called not to pursue wealth to acquire money and possessions. We are to pursue wealth to become generous. We cannot live a split life. We are either with Jesus, or we are not.
