

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

couple of weeks ago, I talked about Vince Lombardi and Don Shula, two famous NFL coaches who were also devout Catholics. In Athat blurb, I concentrated on Coach Lombardi, this week I wish to write about Coach Shula.

In my last year in the seminary, I watched Coach Shula being interviewed by Ed Werner of ESP on television. Mr. Werner asked Coach Shula of all his accomplishments in coaching what was the one achievement he was most proud of.

Coach Shula answered by saying that a few years previously he had been invited to a Communion breakfast hosted by the Archdiocese of Miami. He said that he was honoured to be seated at the same table with Mother Teresa who was the guest speaker at the event. Coach Shula told Ed Werner that he was in the presence of holiness and that all his football accomplishments paled in comparison to what Mother Teresa had achieved and was still doing in her life.

I brought up this beautiful story this Sunday, because just this past Friday we celebrated Mother Teresa's memorial. She is now known by the Saint name of Saint Teresa of Calcutta.

Our Gospel passage today is about Jesus' call to discipleship, and what better example of answering Jesus' call is there than Mother Teresa? In her we can see everything Jesus meant by His three-fold requirement of discipleship.

First: "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." Second: "whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." And third: "Everyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

Frankly, these are impossible demands, but to say they are impossible demands is not an excuse to not try to live them. Mother Teresa's life proves that with grace all things are possible. Mother Teresa left everything for the sake of Christ; her life became one of carrying the cross. What she chose to do was not easy. It cost her dearly, but in her suffering, she was able to identify more with Christ. She described her radical urge to follow Christ as a 'thirst'. That 'thirst'

made it possible for her to follow Christ despite the cost.

This is our example. While we don't literally hate our families and friends, or give everything we own away, we must change our perspective toward them. Nothing, absolutely nothing, must stand between us and following Christ. He told us it would be hard, but He also promised to help. Our challenge is to try.
