A Word From Our Pastor:

ast month, the classic movie channel TCM had their annual Summer Under the Stars Marathon throughout the month of August. Each day during the month, the channel honours a specific star for 24 hours.

One of the stars who was honoured was Ann Bancroft. Her most famous role was that of Annie Sullivan who taught Helen Keller, played by Patty Duke, to learn to speak and to communicate after she had lost the ability to hear or see as an infant. The film, titled "The Miracle Worker" was made in 1962 and it was a powerful one, powerful to this day. For her performance Anne Bancroft received the Oscar for Best Actress.

The movie not only shows the struggles that Annie Sullivan had in teaching Helen Keller, but also the prejudices she endured throughout the story. Keller's parents basically rejected her methods. The family was from Alabama and Sullivan was from the North. This was only 25 years after the end of the U.S. Civil War. Annie Sullivan was also nearly blind herself, she in fact, had undergone several operations which made her condition even worse. By the end of her life, she was totally blind. Still, she overcame these hurdles and helped the young Helen.

I always enjoy how the movie ends. The film could have ended with it how the two women's relationship grew over the years and how Helen Keller became a very popular spokesperson until her death in 1968. However, the movie ends with Anne Bancroft sitting in a rocking chair and Patty Duke coming to her and sitting on her lap as Bancroft holds her and rocks. Subtle in many ways, because the teacher was able to breakdown the barriers which had prevented the child from being able to communicate and to be welcomed. A very powerful scene in many ways.

The Gospel today shows an individual like Helen Keller who was basically cut off from the rest of the world. Yes, he could see, but he was isolated, as Helen Keller was, in many ways.

This Gospel passage shows Jesus performing a profound miracle, but as often happens in the Gospel of Mark, the witnesses are urged to be silent. Jesus did not want to be seen as merely a miracle worker, like Annie Sullivan. He came to be defined by something else. It would be the Cross that would define Him, not the miracles He performed. Mark's miracle stories reveal a reality that is yet to come. We look forward to a day without prejudice.

The miracle in today's reading cured a man's hearing. Hearing properly, he could speak properly. We must hear Jesus clearly everyday and make sure our hearing is truly open, or we will not speak properly either. Our words may be properly pronounced, but our choice of words may reveal a continuing inability to hear Jesus as He is meant to be heard.

The words of Jesus must be heard with open ears and open hearts. If they are not, then we might discover that we have a handicap. Our handicap may not be physical, it may be that we have a handicap of the heart.

Annie Sullivan was able to perform a miracle with Helen Keller. We need to be open in our lives so that Jesus can give us the ability to hear, to see, and to speak His words and gifts in our lives.
