True Purity

Saint Mark who wrote his Gospel primarily for converts from Rome who had not visited Israel, so in various passages he explains for his readers' benefits the meaning of certain Jewish customs. He tells us then that the Jews and especially the Pharisees, *do not eat unless they wash their hands, observing the tradition of the elders; and when they come from the market place, they do not eat unless they purify themselves; and there are many other traditions which they observe, the washing of cups and pots and vessels of bronze.*

These purifications were not done simply for hygienic reasons or out of politeness; they had in fact a religious significance, symbolizing the moral purity needed in order to approach God. In Psalm 24, which was part of the liturgical rite of entry to the Jerusalem sanctuary, it says: *Who shall ascend the hill of the Lord? And who shall stand in his holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart.* ^{Cf PS 24:3:4} Purity of heart appears as a condition for approaching God, for taking part in His worship and being able to behold His face. But the Pharisees hadn't got beyond the purely external level and even added to the intricacy of the rites while neglecting their fundamental aspect, namely, cleanness of heart, of which all the rest was merely a sign and a symbol.

But what then do we mean by interior purity or what does St. James mean about religion that is undefiled? We need not look at anything but what our faith teaches us as the fundamental theological virtues. Virtues of faith by which we have a sense of loyalty and innocence to our commitment to Christ, despite the scepticism that doubts everything except which it happens to like. Such scepticism is not purely 'rational' or 'scientific' as it claims to be. But we know Christ and we know that He cannot deceive or be deceived. We are called to a hope that knows that Christ's grace will always be there and to avoid the pessimism that sometimes meets our expectation and we must never cease in loving our neighbour and being charitable to them however we can. Interior purity also means not looking at our neighbours as means to our profit (only important if they do something for us) they too are God's creation and have a worth in simply being them. This also means that it would be wrong to use them to fulfil our own bodily needs, an aspect of purity of soul is purity of body and concentrate with our vocation in life. Humans are body and soul and what effects one affects the other.

All taken together, this means that we also need another virtue too, fortitude. Fortitude to lead us to avoid these near occasions of scepticism and doubt, it also means that we do not seek out places, situations or images that is injurious to our spiritual life. This also counts in our entertainment. We are always Christians regardless of what we are currently doing and so we act with virtue, modesty and decoration in all our activities. This does not limit us in the least to things which are dull and closed-minded. Much that the Lord gives us is good and joyful but a prudent person knows that not everything is of the Lord, and so this way of life frees us to be who we want to be first and foremost, a child of God.

Doing this we know will not protect us from everything that is not in keeping with the purity of life we want. It is not always easy to live in surroundings that may have lost their Christian outlook. But we know Christ's grace will be there for us not simply to avoid these situations but perhaps if possible even raise them in tone for the sake of our brothers and sisters.
