#### THE THIRD SUNDAY of ADVENT

The liturgy of today's Mass repeats the words of St. Paul in which he urges the first Christians of Philipi: *Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice.* Phil<sup>4:4</sup> And the Apostle goes on to give the basic reason for this profound happiness: *the Lord is at hand.* 

This is also the joy of Advent. We call today Gaudete Sunday, Sunday of rejoicing. We wear rose vestments to signify that while we wait we are happy. Happiness should be essential to the Christian. Ours, however, is not just any sort of happiness. It is the happiness of Christ, which brings justice and peace. Only He can give it and preserve it, because the world does not possess its secret. Worldly happiness leads inevitably to its own loss,,,; it arises precisely when we contrive to escape from our selves, when we look outwards, when we manage to turn our gaze away from meaningless and a solitary interior life. The Christian carries his joy within, because they meet God in his soul in grace. This is the unfailing spring of happiness.

It is not difficult to imagine Our Lady, in these days of Advent, radiant with joy at carrying the Son of God beneath her heart. John the Baptist prepared for this too. He was the greatest of the prophets for he immediately prepared for Christ but he did not see to it personally, so he was least in that kingdom of joy until he entered heaven himself.

The Christian's happiness is profound and can exist in the midst of difficulties. It is compatible with pain, with illness, with failures and contradictions. Our Lord has promised: *Your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you.* <sup>John 16:22</sup> Unless we separate ourselves from its source, nothing and nobody can take away this joyful peace. Gaudete Rejoice!
