<u>Liturgy of the Word – The Gospel</u> <u>and the Homily</u>

Pride of place in the Liturgy of the Word is given to the proclamation of the Gospel. The singing of an acclamation befitting the liturgical season precedes

the reading of the Gospel. Because the Gospel contains the worlds of Christ Himself, special reverence is paid to the Book of the Gospels. The Book of the Gospels is a separate book from the Lectionary from which the other readings are proclaimed. It is the only book that may be carried in procession during the Liturgy, and when it is used it is placed on the Altar at the beginning of the Mass. A procession often takes place during the singing of the acclamation at which point the priest or deacon preaching the Gospel carries the Book of the Gospels to the Ambo. The Gospel must be read by a man in Holy Orders: a bishop, priest, or deacon. It is particularly appropriate that one in Holy Orders proclaim the Gospel because of their ordination they speak for Christ and the Gospel contains the words of Christ. Before reading the Gospel, the priest may incense the Gospel book. The response of the faithful at the conclusion of the reading of the Gospel is "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." This response reflects the understanding of the Church that Christ Himself speaks in the Gospel. His message gives the faithful cause to praise revealing as it does the means for salvation. The Homily follows the reading of the Gospel and it must be given by a bishop, priest, or deacon. It is part of the Liturgy of the Word and of the priest's exercise of his prophetic (teaching) office. The principal purpose of the Homily is for the priest to explain what has been proclaimed in the Gospel and the readings. It is also very appropriate for his to discuss the texts or themes from the Mass, drawing out their meaning and significance so as to enable the faithful to participate in the Mass more fully and actively.


